Definitions of "Adulthood" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “adulthood” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The state (and responsibilities) of a person who has attained maturity.*
- *The period of time in your life after your physical growth has stopped and you are fully developed.*
- *The state or condition of being fully grown or mature.*

maturity An insurance policy security etc having a fixed maturity date.
*Interest is not paid until **maturity**.*

Usage Examples of "Adulthood" as a noun

- *Most of the larvae die, although some survive to adulthood.*
- *The crucial years between adolescence and adulthood.*

Associations of "Adulthood" (30 Words)

adolescence The time period between the beginning of puberty and adulthood.
*During **adolescence** teenagers often experience violent mood swings.*

adolescent An adolescent boy or girl.
***Adolescent** boys and girls.*

adult	Suitable only for adults used euphemistically to refer to a sexually explicit film book or magazine. <i>An adult woman.</i>
age	A particular stage in someone's life. <i>Children of primary school age.</i>
aged	Advanced in years aged is pronounced as two syllables. <i>Aged rocks.</i>
aging	Acquiring desirable qualities by being left undisturbed for some time.
anachronistic	Belonging to a period other than that being portrayed. <i>English public schools are anachronistic.</i>
antiquate	Make obsolete or old-fashioned.
dowdy	Lacking in smartness or taste. <i>A dowdy grey outfit.</i>
doyen	The most respected or prominent person in a particular field. <i>He became the doyen of British physicists.</i>
grandpa	The father of your father or mother.
grow	Cause to grow or develop. <i>We grow wheat here.</i>
grown	Fully developed. <i>A grown woman.</i>
hoary	Used in names of animals and plants covered with whitish fur or short hairs e.g. hoary bat hoary cress. <i>Hoary jokes.</i>
immature	(used of living things especially persons) in an early period of life or development or growth. <i>Immature behavior.</i>
infancy	The early stage of growth or development. <i>Opinion polls were in their infancy.</i>
late	Of a later stage in the development of a language or literature used especially of dead languages. <i>Talked late into the evening.</i>
mangy	In poor condition; shabby. <i>A mangy carpet.</i>
manhood	The status of being a man. <i>The unity of Godhead and manhood in Christ.</i>

maturation	The process by which wine or other fermented drinks become ready for drinking. <i>White wines generally need less maturation than reds.</i>
maturational	Relating to or involved in maturation.
mature	Fully developed or matured and ready to be eaten or used. <i>Full bodied mature wines.</i>
maturity	An insurance policy security etc having a fixed maturity date. <i>Interest is not paid until maturity.</i>
senescence	Loss of a cell's power of division and growth.
senescent	Growing old.
seniority	The property of being long-lived. <i>Pay and benefits rise with seniority.</i>
superannuated	Too old to be useful- Anthony Trollope. <i>She is not superannuated and has no paid holiday.</i>
teenage	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. <i>A teenage girl.</i>
teenager	A person aged between 13 and 19 years.
yore	Time long past.
