- advancement** The act of moving forward (as toward a goal).  
*Their lives were devoted to the **advancement** of science.*
- ameliorate** Make (something bad or unsatisfactory) better.  
*The reform did much to **ameliorate** living standards.*
- amelioration** The act of making something better; improvement.  
*Progress brings with it the **amelioration** of the human condition.*
- augment** A vowel prefixed to past tenses of verbs in Greek and certain other Indo-European languages.  
*He **augmented** his summer income by painting houses.*
- better** Changed for the better in health or fitness.  
*A change for the **better**.*

<b>betterment</b>	The improvement of something. <i>They believed that what they were doing was vital for the <b>betterment</b> of society.</i>
<b>bolster</b>	Prop up with a pillow or bolster. <i><b>Bolster</b> morale.</i>
<b>develop</b>	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i><b>Develop</b> the rook.</i>
<b>developed</b>	(of a country or region) advanced economically and socially. <i>A strongman with well <b>developed</b> muscles.</i>
<b>efficiency</b>	An action designed to achieve efficiency. <i>She did the work with great <b>efficiency</b>.</i>
<b>enhance</b>	Increase. <i>His refusal does nothing to <b>enhance</b> his reputation.</i>
<b>enhancement</b>	An improvement that makes something more agreeable. <i>The <b>enhancement</b> of civic amenities.</i>
<b>enrich</b>	Increase the nutritive value of (food) by adding vitamins or nutrients. <i>Her exposure to museums <b>enriched</b> her life in France.</i>
<b>evolve</b>	Undergo development or evolution. <i>The company has <b>evolved</b> into a major chemical manufacturer.</i>
<b>expansion</b>	A thing formed by the enlargement or broadening of something. <i>The <b>expansion</b> of <math>a^2</math> is <math>a^2 + 2ab + b^2</math>.</i>
<b>forego</b>	Lose (s.th.) or lose the right to (s.th.) by some error, offense, or crime.
<b>further</b>	In addition or furthermore. <i><b>Further</b> in the future.</i>
<b>improve</b>	Make or become better. <i>The editor <b>improved</b> the manuscript with his changes.</i>
<b>improvement</b>	The act of improving something. <i>Their <b>improvements</b> increased the value of the property.</i>
<b>increase</b>	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The <b>increase</b> is scheduled for next month.</i>
<b>meliorate</b>	To make better.
<b>optimize</b>	Act as an optimist and take a sunny view of the world. <i><b>Optimize</b> a computer program.</i>
<b>productivity</b>	The ratio of the quantity and quality of units produced to the labor per unit of time. <i>Workers have boosted <b>productivity</b> by 30 per cent.</i>

<b>progress</b>	Cause a task or undertaking to make progress. <i>Great <b>progress</b> in the arts.</i>
<b>progressively</b>	In a forward-looking, innovative manner. <i>Symptoms become <b>progressively</b> worse over a period of years.</i>
<b>reelect</b>	Elect again.
<b>refine</b>	Make more precise or increase the discriminatory powers of. <i><b>Refine</b> sugar.</i>
<b>sere</b>	Having lost all moisture. <i>The desert was edged with <b>sere</b> vegetation.</i>
<b>upgrade</b>	To improve what was old or outdated. <i>A room <b>upgrade</b> from a twin to a duplex suite.</i>
<b>uplift</b>	Fill with high spirits; fill with optimism. <i>There s been an <b>uplift</b> in revenue.</i>
