
Advancing as an Adjective

amelioration	The act of making something better; improvement. Progress brings with it the amelioration of the human condition.
augment	A vowel prefixed to past tenses of verbs in Greek and certain other Indo- European languages. <i>He augmented his summer income by painting houses.</i>
better	Changed for the better in health or fitness. A change for the better .



betterment	The improvement of something. They believed that what they were doing was vital for the betterment of society.
bolster	Prop up with a pillow or bolster. Bolster morale.
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. Develop the rook.
developed	(of a country or region) advanced economically and socially. A strongman with well developed muscles.
efficiency	An action designed to achieve efficiency. She did the work with great efficiency .
enhance	Increase. His refusal does nothing to enhance his reputation.
enhancement	An improvement that makes something more agreeable. <i>The enhancement of civic amenities.</i>
<u>enrich</u>	Increase the nutritive value of (food) by adding vitamins or nutrients. Her exposure to museums enrich ed her life in France.
evolve	Undergo development or evolution. The company has evolve d into a major chemical manufacturer.
expansion	A thing formed by the enlargement or broadening of something. <i>The</i> expansion of <i>a b 2 is a 2 2ab b 2</i> .
<u>forego</u>	Lose (s.th.) or lose the right to (s.th.) by some error, offense, or crime.
<u>further</u>	In addition or furthermore. <i>Further</i> in the future.
improve	Make or become better. The editor improve d the manuscript with his changes.
improvement	The act of improving something. Their improvement s increased the value of the property.
increase	A change resulting in an increase. The increase is scheduled for next month.
meliorate	To make better.
<u>optimize</u>	Act as an optimist and take a sunny view of the world. Optimize a computer program.
productivity	The ratio of the quantity and quality of units produced to the labor per unit of time. Workers have boosted productivity by 30 per cent.



progress	Cause a task or undertaking to make progress.
	Great progress in the arts.
progressively	In a forward-looking, innovative manner. Symptoms become progressively worse over a period of years.
reelect	Elect again.
<u>refine</u>	Make more precise or increase the discriminatory powers of. <i>Refine</i> sugar.
sere	Having lost all moisture. The desert was edged with sere vegetation.
<u>upgrade</u>	To improve what was old or outdated. A room upgrade from a twin to a duplex suite.
<u>uplift</u>	Fill with high spirits; fill with optimism. <i>There s been an uplift in revenue.</i>
