*Their lives were devoted to the **advancement** of science.*
- ameliorate** Make (something bad or unsatisfactory) better.
*The reform did much to **ameliorate** living standards.*
- amelioration** The act of making something better; improvement.
*Progress brings with it the **amelioration** of the human condition.*
- augment** A vowel prefixed to past tenses of verbs in Greek and certain other Indo-European languages.
*He **augmented** his summer income by painting houses.*
- better** Changed for the better in health or fitness.
*A change for the **better**.*

bolster	Prop up with a pillow or bolster. <i>Bolster morale.</i>
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>Develop the rook.</i>
developed	(of a country or region) advanced economically and socially. <i>A strongman with well developed muscles.</i>
efficiency	An action designed to achieve efficiency. <i>She did the work with great efficiency.</i>
enhance	Increase. <i>His refusal does nothing to enhance his reputation.</i>
enhancement	An improvement that makes something more agreeable. <i>The enhancement of civic amenities.</i>
enrich	Increase the nutritive value of (food) by adding vitamins or nutrients. <i>Her exposure to museums enriched her life in France.</i>
evolve	Undergo development or evolution. <i>The company has evolved into a major chemical manufacturer.</i>
expansion	A thing formed by the enlargement or broadening of something. <i>The expansion of a^2 is $a^2 + 2ab + b^2$.</i>
forego	Lose (s.th.) or lose the right to (s.th.) by some error, offense, or crime.
further	In addition or furthermore. <i>Further in the future.</i>
improve	Make or become better. <i>The editor improved the manuscript with his changes.</i>
improvement	The act of improving something. <i>Their improvements increased the value of the property.</i>
increase	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The increase is scheduled for next month.</i>
meliorate	To make better.
optimize	Act as an optimist and take a sunny view of the world. <i>Optimize a computer program.</i>
productivity	The ratio of the quantity and quality of units produced to the labor per unit of time. <i>Workers have boosted productivity by 30 per cent.</i>

progress	Cause a task or undertaking to make progress. <i>Great progress in the arts.</i>
progressively	In a forward-looking, innovative manner. <i>Symptoms become progressively worse over a period of years.</i>
reelect	Elect again.
refine	Make more precise or increase the discriminatory powers of. <i>Refine sugar.</i>
sere	Having lost all moisture. <i>The desert was edged with sere vegetation.</i>
upgrade	To improve what was old or outdated. <i>A room upgrade from a twin to a duplex suite.</i>
uplift	Fill with high spirits; fill with optimism. <i>There s been an uplift in revenue.</i>
