- *The arrival of a notable person or thing.*
- *The season including the four Sundays preceding Christmas.*

materialization	Something that comes into existence as a result. <i>The materialization of her dream.</i>
<u>occurrence</u>	An incident or event. <i>A disease of frequent occurrence.</i>
<u>origin</u>	A fixed point from which coordinates are measured. <i>Origin in sensation.</i>
parousia	The reappearance of Jesus as judge for the Last Judgment.
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>The bird has a display flight of steep flapping rises.</i>
second advent	A 60th part of a minute of arc.
second coming	A speech seconding a motion.
second coming of christ	A particular point in time.
surfacing	Emerging to the surface and becoming apparent.

first	The fielding position of the player on a baseball team who is stationed at first of the bases in the infield counting counterclockwise from home plate. <i>The first phase of his training.</i>
forthcoming	Of the relatively near future. <i>Federal funds were not forthcoming.</i>
genesis	The origin or mode of formation of something. <i>This tale had its genesis in fireside stories.</i>
germinal	Providing material for future development. <i>A germinal idea.</i>
introduction	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. <i>A letter of introduction.</i>
introductory	Serving as an introduction to a subject or topic; basic or preliminary. <i>We are making a special introductory offer of a reduced subscription.</i>
oncoming	The beginning or early stages. <i>She walked into the path of an oncoming car.</i>
onset	A military attack. <i>The onset of pneumonia.</i>
originate	Come into existence; take on form or shape. <i>The flight originates in Calcutta.</i>
preamble	A preliminary introduction to a statute or constitution (usually explaining its purpose). <i>He could tell that what she said was by way of a preamble.</i>
preface	Provide a book with a preface. <i>It is important to preface the debate with a general comment.</i>
preliminary	A preliminary round in a sporting competition. <i>A preliminary draft.</i>

preparatory	Serving as or carrying out preparation for a task or undertaking. <i>Preparatory steps.</i>
prologue	The actor who delivers the prologue in a play. <i>I got third in the prologue and eighth on the hardest stage.</i>
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>Rise to the occasion.</i>
<u>shortly</u>	In a short time; soon. <i>The new database will shortly be available for consultation.</i>
<u>soon</u>	In the near future. <i>I d just as soon Tim did it.</i>
start	The act of starting something. <i>It was off to a good start.</i>
starting	(especially of eyes) bulging or protruding as with fear. <i>With eyes starting from their sockets.</i>
<u>thereafter</u>	After that time. <i>It was agreed that the meeting be held annually thereafter.</i>
upcoming	About to happen; forthcoming. <i>The upcoming election.</i>
