<b>disruptive</b>	(of a company or form of technology) causing radical change in an existing industry or market through being innovative. <i><b>Disruptive</b> pupils.</i>
<b>enterprising</b>	Marked by imagination, initiative, and readiness to undertake new projects. <i>Some <b>enterprising</b> teachers have started their own recycling programmes.</i>
<b>fearless</b>	Invulnerable to fear or intimidation. <i>A <b>fearless</b> crusader for animal rights.</i>
<b>heroic</b>	Relating to or characteristic of heroes of antiquity. <i>Of <b>heroic</b> proportions.</i>
<b>imaginative</b>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. <i>He was <b>imaginative</b> beyond all other architects.</i>
<b>ingenious</b>	(of a person) clever, original, and inventive. <i>An <b>ingenious</b> solution to the problem.</i>
<b>innovative</b>	(of a product, idea, etc.) featuring new methods; advanced and original. <i><b>Innovative</b> ways to help unemployed people.</i>
<b>intrepid</b>	Invulnerable to fear or intimidation. <i>Our <b>intrepid</b> reporter.</i>
<b>inventive</b>	Showing creativity or original thought. <i>The most <b>inventive</b> composer of his time.</i>
<b>original</b>	Present or existing from the beginning; first or earliest. <i>The <b>original</b> cast.</i>
<b>resourceful</b>	Having the ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties. <i>The most <b>resourceful</b> cook in town.</i>
<b>unafraid</b>	Feeling no fear or anxiety. <i>She was calm and <b>unafraid</b>.</i>
<b>undaunted</b>	Not intimidated or discouraged by difficulty, danger, or disappointment. <i>They were <b>undaunted</b> by the huge amount of work needed.</i>
<b>unshrinking</b>	Not shrinking from danger.
<b>valiant</b>	Possessing or showing courage or determination. <i>She made a <b>valiant</b> effort to hold her anger in check.</i>

**valorous**

Having or showing valor.

**Valorous** deeds on the field of honour.

**venturesome**

Willing to take risks or embark on difficult or unusual courses of action.

Anyone **venturesome** enough to try to blaze a trail through it would soon beat a hasty retreat.

<b>daring</b>	Adventurous courage. <i>A <b>daring</b> crime.</i>
<b>daringly</b>	In an original manner.
<b>escapade</b>	Any carefree episode. <i>Schoolgirl <b>escapades</b>.</i>
<b>gall</b>	An animal s gall bladder. <i>Accept life s <b>gall</b> without blaming somebody else.</i>
<b>gallant</b>	Having or displaying great dignity or nobility. <i>She had made <b>gallant</b> efforts to pull herself together.</i>
<b>gallantry</b>	Gallant actions or words. <i>No young man offers to carry this burden for her such <b>gallantry</b> is out of fashion.</i>
