adventuresome	Given to adventures or to running risks; adventurous. <i>The risks and gains of an adventuresome economy.</i>
audacious	Showing a willingness to take surprisingly bold risks. <i>An audacious interpretation of two Jacobean dramas.</i>
bold	Fearless and daring. <i>A bold speech.</i>
brave	Invulnerable to fear or intimidation. <i>Girls decked out in brave new dresses.</i>
creative	Promoting construction or creation. <i>Creative writing.</i>
daredevil	Presumptuously daring. <i>A daredevil skydiver.</i>
daring	(of a person or action) adventurous or audaciously bold. <i>He rapidly discovered an audience hungry for his daring new works.</i>

dashing	Lively and spirited. <i>A dashing black fedora.</i>
dauntless	Showing fearlessness and determination. <i>Dauntless bravery.</i>
disruptive	(of a company or form of technology) causing radical change in an existing industry or market through being innovative. <i>Disruptive pupils.</i>
enterprising	Marked by imagination, initiative, and readiness to undertake new projects. <i>Some enterprising teachers have started their own recycling programmes.</i>
fearless	Invulnerable to fear or intimidation. <i>A fearless crusader for animal rights.</i>
heroic	Relating to or characteristic of heroes of antiquity. <i>Of heroic proportions.</i>
imaginative	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. <i>He was imaginative beyond all other architects.</i>
ingenious	(of a person) clever, original, and inventive. <i>An ingenious solution to the problem.</i>
innovative	(of a product, idea, etc.) featuring new methods; advanced and original. <i>Innovative ways to help unemployed people.</i>
intrepid	Invulnerable to fear or intimidation. <i>Our intrepid reporter.</i>
inventive	Showing creativity or original thought. <i>The most inventive composer of his time.</i>
original	Present or existing from the beginning; first or earliest. <i>The original cast.</i>
resourceful	Having the ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties. <i>The most resourceful cook in town.</i>
unafraid	Feeling no fear or anxiety. <i>She was calm and unafraid.</i>
undaunted	Not intimidated or discouraged by difficulty, danger, or disappointment. <i>They were undaunted by the huge amount of work needed.</i>
unshrinking	Not shrinking from danger.
valiant	Possessing or showing courage or determination. <i>She made a valiant effort to hold her anger in check.</i>

valorous

Having or showing valor.

Valorous deeds on the field of honour.

venturesome

Willing to take risks or embark on difficult or unusual courses of action.

Anyone **venturesome** enough to try to blaze a trail through it would soon beat a hasty retreat.

audacious	Unrestrained by convention or propriety. <i>Audacious explorers.</i>
audacity	Fearless daring. <i>She had the audacity to suggest I d been carrying on with him.</i>
bold	A bold typeface or letter. <i>A bold design.</i>
boldly	In a way that is characterized by having a strong, vivid, or clear appearance. <i>We urge the educational community to act boldly.</i>
boldness	The quality of standing out strongly and distinctly. <i>You will overlook my boldness I hope.</i>
<u>brave</u>	People who are brave. <i>His medals made a brave show.</i>

bravely	In a way that shows a willingness to face and endure danger or pain; courageously. <i>Bravely he went into the burning house.</i>
bravery	Feeling no fear. <i>Perhaps I ll get a medal for bravery.</i>
coolness	The quality of being soothing or refreshing because of its low temperature. <i>The refreshing coolness of the water.</i>
courage	Strength in the face of pain or grief. <i>She called on all her courage to face the ordeal.</i>
courageous	Possessing or displaying courage; able to face and deal with danger or fear without flinching- Herman Melville- Willia. <i>Set a courageous example by leading them safely into and out of enemy held territory.</i>
daring	Adventurous courage. <i>A daring crime.</i>
daringly	In an original manner.
escapade	Any carefree episode. <i>Schoolgirl escapades.</i>
gall	An animal s gall bladder. <i>Accept life s gall without blaming somebody else.</i>
gallant	Having or displaying great dignity or nobility. <i>She had made gallant efforts to pull herself together.</i>
gallantry	Gallant actions or words. <i>No young man offers to carry this burden for her such gallantry is out of fashion.</i>
heroic	A verse form suited to the treatment of heroic or elevated themes dactylic hexameter or iambic pentameter. <i>Early medieval heroic poetry.</i>
impudence	The trait of being rude and impertinent; inclined to take liberties. <i>His arrogance and impudence had offended many.</i>
journey	Undertake a journey or trip. <i>They journeyed south.</i>
plucky	Showing courage. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
resourcefulness	The ability to deal resourcefully with unusual problems. <i>A man of great resourcefulness.</i>

<u>tour</u>	Make a tour of an area. <i>She joined the Royal Shakespeare Company on tour.</i>
travel	The action of travelling. <i>Perhaps you ll write a book about your travels.</i>
<u>traveler</u>	A person who changes location.
unflinching	Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty. <i>He has shown unflinching determination throughout the campaign.</i>
<u>valiant</u>	Having or showing valor. <i>A valiant attempt to prevent the hijack.</i>
<u>valor</u>	The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle). <i>He received a medal for valor.</i>
valorous	Having or showing valor. <i>Valorous deeds on the field of honour.</i>
venturous	Disposed to venture or take risks. <i>Five venturous young men.</i>
