## Associations of "Adversaries" (30 Words)

<b><a href="#">aggressor</a></b>	A person or country that attacks another first. As another option or possibility; alternatively.
<b>alternately</b>	<i><b>Alternately</b> slice the cake in two when completely cooled and spread raspberry jam between the two halves.</i>
<b>antagonist</b>	A muscle that relaxes while another contracts. <i>When bending the elbow the triceps are the <b>antagonist</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">antithesis</a></b>	A contrast or opposition between two things. <i>Figures of speech such as <b>antithesis</b>.</i>
<b>antithetic</b>	Sharply contrasted in character or purpose. <i>Hope is <b>antithetic</b> to despair.</i>
<b>antithetical</b>	Directly opposed or contrasted; mutually incompatible. <i>People whose religious beliefs are <b>antithetical</b> to mine.</i>
<b><a href="#">assailant</a></b>	A person who physically attacks another. <i>The police have no firm leads about the identity of his <b>assailant</b>.</i>
<b>challenger</b>	The contestant you hope to defeat. <i>New championship <b>challengers</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">compete</a></b>	Compete for something engage in a contest measure oneself against others. <i>He <b>competed</b> in numerous track meets as a child.</i>
<b>competitor</b>	An organization or country engaged in commercial or economic competition with others. <i>Two <b>competitors</b> were banned for taking drugs.</i>
<b>conflicting</b>	On bad terms. <i><b>Conflicting</b> opinions.</i>
<b><a href="#">contender</a></b>	A person or group competing with others to achieve something. <i>The major <b>contenders</b> in the football championship.</i>
<b>contrarily</b>	Contrary to expectations.

<b>diametrical</b>	Characterized by opposite extremes; completely opposed. <i>He s the <b>diametrical</b> opposite of Gabriel.</i>
<b>dissent</b>	The act of protesting a public often organized manifestation of dissent. <i>He wasted no time in cranking out nine majority opinions as well as three <b>dissents</b>.</i>
<b>enemy</b>	A personal enemy. <i>The <b>enemy</b> attacked at dawn.</i>
<b>foe</b>	A personal enemy. <i>They had been political <b>foes</b> for years.</i>
<b>inverse</b>	Opposite or contrary in position, direction, order, or effect. <i><b>Inverse</b> logarithms.</i>
<b>negation</b>	A negative statement; a statement that is a refusal or denial of some other statement. <i>These formulae and their <b>negations</b>.</i>
<b>nemesis</b>	A downfall caused by an inescapable agent. <i>Will Harry Potter finally defeat his <b>nemesis</b> Voldemort.</i>
<b>objector</b>	A person who dissents from some established policy. <i><b>Objectors</b> to the housing plans.</i>
<b>opponent</b>	A contestant that you are matched against. <i><b>Opponent</b> or opposing armies.</i>
<b>opposing</b>	Characterized by active hostility. <i>The <b>opposing</b> team.</i>
<b>opposite</b>	Characterized by opposite extremes completely opposed. <i>At <b>opposite</b> poles.</i>
<b>opposition</b>	A contestant that you are matched against. <i>The invaders encountered stiff <b>opposition</b>.</i>
<b>other</b>	Very unusual; different in character or quality from the normal or expected- Lance Morrow. <i>The <b>other</b> evening.</i>
<b>polarity</b>	The state of having two opposite or contradictory tendencies, opinions, or aspects. <i>The sponge possessing an axis of <b>polarity</b> carries an incurrent siphon at one end and an excurrent siphon at the other.</i>
<b>rival</b>	Be the rival of be in competition with. <i>Nothing can <b>rival</b> cotton for durability.</i>

**vengeance** The act of taking revenge (harming someone in retaliation for something harmful that they have done) especially in the next life.  
*For **vengeance** I would do nothing This nation is too great to look for mere revenge.*

**vindictive** Disposed to seek revenge or intended for revenge.  
*The criticism was both **vindictive** and personalized.*
