
## Adversity as a Noun

- A difficult or unpleasant situation.

**pain**A somatic sensation of acute discomfort.

An event or circumstance that causes sorrow.

suffering Psychological suffering.

torment A feeling of intense annoyance caused by being tormented.

Extreme mental distress. torture

trauma

A personal **trauma** like the death of a child.

An annoying or frustrating or catastrophic event. tribulation

The **tribulation**s of being a megastar.

Effort or exertion made to do something, especially when inconvenient. trouble

What is the **trouble**.

Misery resulting from affliction. woe

To add to his **woe**s customers have been spending less.

wretchedness

A state of ill-being due to affliction or misfortune. He has compiled a record second to none in its **wretchedness**.

**befall** (Santayana.

He promised that no harm would **befall** her.

**beset** Assail or attack on all sides.

She was **beset** with self doubt.

**betide**Become of; happen to.

**blow**An act of blowing an instrument. **Blow** on the soup to cool it down.

An event resulting in great loss and misfortune.

cataclysm A sudden violent change in the earth's surface.

The **cataclysm** of the First World War.

catastrophe A sudden violent change in the earth's surface.

Lack of funds has resulted in a **catastrophe** for our school system.

State of uncertainty or perplexity especially as requiring a choice between

**dilemma** equally unfavorable options.

The insoluble **dilemma** of adolescence.

**disaster** A state of extreme (usually irremediable) ruin and misfortune.

His policies were a **disaster**.

**disruption** Disturbance or problems which interrupt an event, activity, or process.

No industry is immune to digital **disruption**.

**earthquake** A disturbance that is extremely disruptive.

A political **earthquake**.

**hardship** Something that causes or entails suffering.

A life of **hardship**.

Destruction or slaughter on a mass scale, especially caused by fire or

**holocaust** nuclear war.

A nuclear **holocaust**.



(of an event regarded as threatening or significant) about to happen;

**impending** forthcoming.

The author had returned to his country ahead of the **impending** war.

An instance of misfortune. misadventure

The coroner recorded a verdict of death by **misadventure**.

An unlucky occurrence. mischance
