<b>advantageous</b>	Giving an advantage. <i>Socially <b>advantageous</b> to entertain often.</i>
<b>appropriate</b>	Suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i>It seems that an apology is <b>appropriate</b>.</i>
<b>apt</b>	(usually followed by `to') naturally disposed toward. <i>An <b>apt</b> pupil.</i>
<b>beneficial</b>	Promoting or enhancing well-being. <i>The process was <b>beneficial</b> to both supplier and customer.</i>
<b>best</b>	(superlative of `good') having the most positive qualities. <i>Her <b>best</b> black suit.</i>
<b>commonsensical</b>	Exhibiting native good judgment. <i>Unlearned and <b>commonsensical</b> countryfolk were capable of solving problems that beset the more sophisticated.</i>

<u>desirable</u>	Worth having or seeking or achieving. <i>It is <b>desirable</b> to check that nothing has been forgotten.</i>
effective	Able to accomplish a purpose functioning effectively. <i>An air cooled motor was more <b>effective</b> than a witch s broomstick for rapid long distance transportation.</i>
expedient	Serving to promote your interest. <i>Was merciful only when mercy was <b>expedient</b>.</i>
fitting	Being precisely fitting and right. <i>A <b>fitting</b> reward.</i>
gainful	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found <b>gainful</b> employment.</i>
helpful	Useful. <i><b>Helpful</b> staff.</i>
judicious	Having, showing, or done with good judgement or sense. <i>The <b>judicious</b> use of public investment.</i>
politic	(of a person) prudent and sagacious. <i>A shrewd and <b>politic</b> reply.</i>
<u>preferable</u>	More desirable than another. <i>Lower interest rates were <b>preferable</b> to higher ones.</i>
<u>profitable</u>	Beneficial; useful. <i>A professionally run and <b>profitable</b> company.</i>
proper	(of a person) good-looking. <i>He finally has a <b>proper</b> job.</i>
<u>prudent</u>	Acting with or showing care and thought for the future. <i><b>Prudent</b> hesitation.</i>
recommended	Advised or suggested as good or suitable. <i>The <b>recommended</b> daily intake of vitamins.</i>
sensible	Able to feel or perceive. <i>A <b>sensible</b> person.</i>
sound	Vigorous or severe. <i>Politicians have no <b>sound</b> grasp of technology issues.</i>
<u>suitable</u>	Right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation. <i>These toys are not <b>suitable</b> for children under five.</i>
useful	Having a useful function. <i>The girl felt motherly and <b>useful</b>.</i>

<b>valuable</b>	Having worth or merit or value. <i>A <b>valuable</b> antique.</i>
<b>well</b>	In a satisfactory state or position. <i>I think I m <b>well</b> at least I feel <b>well</b>.</i>
<b>wise</b>	Evidencing the possession of inside information. <i>He is <b>wise</b> in the ways of haute couture.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Advisable" as an adjective

- *Early booking is advisable.*
- *Such action is neither necessary nor advisable.*
- *It is advisable to carry one of the major credit cards.*
- *It is advisable to telephone first.*
- *Extreme caution is advisable.*

<b>advised</b>	Having the benefit of careful prior consideration or counsel. <i>A well <b>advised</b> delay in carrying out the plan.</i>
<b>bioethics</b>	The ethics of medical and biological research.
<b>casuistry</b>	The use of clever but unsound reasoning, especially in relation to moral questions; sophistry. <i>The minister is engaging in nothing more or less than <b>casuistry</b>.</i>
<u><b>chary</b></u>	Characterized by great caution and wariness. <i>She had been <b>chary</b> of telling the whole truth.</i>
<u><b>chaste</b></u>	Not having any sexual nature or intention. <i>A <b>chaste</b> border of conventionalized flowers.</i>
<u><b>chivalry</b></u>	The medieval principles governing knighthood and knightly conduct. <i>He still retained a sense of <b>chivalry</b> towards women.</i>
<u><b>conscience</b></u>	A person's moral sense of right and wrong, viewed as acting as a guide to one's behaviour. <i>He has no <b>conscience</b> about his cruelty.</i>
<u><b>discreet</b></u>	Intentionally unobtrusive. <i>A <b>discreet</b> silence.</i>
<b>ethic</b>	The principles of right and wrong that are accepted by an individual or a social group. <i>The Puritan <b>ethic</b>.</i>

<b><u>ethical</u></b>	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>Switching to more <b>ethical</b> products.</i>
<b>ethics</b>	The moral correctness of specified conduct. <i>Many scientists question the <b>ethics</b> of cruel experiments.</i>
<b><u>exemplar</u></b>	Something to be imitated. <i>An <b>exemplar</b> of success.</i>
<b>fine</b>	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. <i>Batiste is a cotton fabric with a <b>fine</b> weave.</i>
<b>good</b>	Often used as a combining form in a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>The baby can walk pretty <b>good</b>.</i>
<b>goodness</b>	The beneficial or nourishing element of food. <i>A belief in the basic <b>goodness</b> of mankind.</i>
<b>judicious</b>	Marked by the exercise of good judgment or common sense in practical matters. <i>The <b>judicious</b> use of public investment.</i>
<b>judiciously</b>	With good judgement or sense. <i><b>Judiciously</b> chosen words.</i>
<b>meekness</b>	A disposition to be patient and long suffering. <i>All his best friends make fun of him for his <b>meekness</b>.</i>
<b>moral</b>	A lesson that can be derived from a story or experience. <i>The <b>moral</b> of the story is to love thy neighbor.</i>
<b>provident</b>	Careful in regard to your own interests. <i>A <b>provident</b> father plans for his children s education.</i>
<b><u>prudent</u></b>	Careful and sensible; marked by sound judgment. <i><b>Prudent</b> rulers.</i>
<b><u>righteous</u></b>	Very good; excellent. <i><b>Righteous</b> indignation.</i>
<b><u>superiority</u></b>	A supercilious manner or attitude. <i>He hated the white man s <b>superiority</b> and condescension.</i>
<b><u>tact</u></b>	Consideration in dealing with others and avoiding giving offense. <i>The inspector broke the news to me with <b>tact</b> and consideration.</i>
<b>tactful</b>	Having or showing skill and sensitivity in dealing with others or with difficult issues. <i>They need a <b>tactful</b> word of advice.</i>

<b>values</b>	Beliefs of a person or social group in which they have an emotional investment (either for or against something). <i>He has very conservatives <b>values</b>.</i>
<b>virtue</b>	(in traditional Christian angelology) the seventh-highest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy. <i>Mike was extolling the <b>virtues</b> of the car.</i>
<b>well</b>	Often used as a combining form in a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>I should jolly <b>well</b> hope so.</i>
<b>wise</b>	Sensible or prudent. <i>Fortunately I was already <b>wise</b> to the approach used in this scam.</i>
<u><a href="#">wonderfully</a></u>	In a way that inspires delight or admiration; extremely well. <i>A <b>wonderfully</b> entertaining show.</i>
