agency	A department or body providing a specific service for a government or other organization. <i>Canals carved by the agency of running water.</i>
aid	Help, typically of a practical nature. <i>He saw the pilot slumped in his cockpit and went to his aid.</i>
assistance	A person or thing that is a resource that helps make something easier or possible to do. <i>Economic assistance to depressed areas.</i>
<u>auspices</u>	Kindly endorsement and guidance. <i>The tournament was held under the auspices of the city council.</i>
backing	Financial resources provided to make some project possible. <i>The fabric has a special backing for durability.</i>
breastplate	Armor plate that protects the chest; the front part of a cuirass.

care	A feeling of or occasion for anxiety. <i>The child is in the care of her grandparents.</i>
championship	The position or title of the winner of a championship contest. <i>Louise Gibson retained the women s championship.</i>
charge	The price charged for some article or service. <i>A cavalry charge.</i>
defence	(psychiatry) an unconscious process that tries to reduce the anxiety associated with instinctive desires. <i>Dribbling through defences.</i>
egis	Armor plate that protects the chest; the front part of a cuirass.
guaranty	A collateral agreement to answer for the debt of another in case that person defaults.
guardianship	Attention and management implying responsibility for safety. <i>Guardianship of traditional beliefs and standards.</i>
guidance	The act of setting and holding a course. <i>A laser guidance system.</i>
keeping	A cell in a jail or prison. <i>His behavior was not in keeping with the occasion.</i>
patronage	The regular custom attracted by a shop, restaurant, etc. <i>Even before noon there was a considerable patronage.</i>
protection	Protection money paid to criminals especially on a regular basis. <i>The witnesses demanded police protection.</i>
protectorship	The position of protector.
safeguarding	A document or escort providing safe passage through a region especially in time of war.
shelter	Protective covering that provides protection from the weather. <i>He hung back in the shelter of a rock.</i>
sponsorship	The act of sponsoring (either officially or financially). <i>We raised about 6 000 in sponsorship.</i>
supervision	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>He was placed under the supervision of a probation officer.</i>
support	The action of supporting something or someone or the state of being supported. <i>The team enjoyed the support of their fans.</i>
trusteeship	A dependent country; administered by another country under the supervision of the United Nations.

umbrella A device consisting of a circular canopy of cloth on a folding metal frame supported by a central rod, used as protection against rain.
*An air **umbrella** over England.*

awning	A sheet of canvas or other material stretched on a frame and used to keep the sun or rain off a shop window, doorway, or ship's deck.
bodyguard	A person or group of people employed to escort and protect an important or famous person.
chaperone	Accompany as a chaperone. <i>Chaperones sat at the edge of the dance gossiping and watching.</i>
conservation	(physics) the maintenance of a certain quantities unchanged during chemical reactions or physical transformations. <i>The artworks in the collection need indexing and conservation.</i>
conservationist	Someone who works to protect the environment from destruction or pollution. <i>Conservationist groups.</i>
convoy	A procession of land vehicles traveling together. <i>The trucks convoyed the cars across the battle zone.</i>
defend	Fight against or resist strongly. <i>Ms Smith will represent the defendant.</i>
defense	The act of defending someone or something against attack or injury. <i>A good boxer needs a good defense.</i>
defensible	Justifiable by argument. <i>A fort with a defensible yard at its feet.</i>
environmentalist	A person who is concerned about protecting the environment. <i>The environmentalist movement.</i>
greenpeace	An international organization that works for environmental conservation and the preservation of endangered species.
guard	The person who plays the position of guard on a basketball team. <i>There s bends all the way from Portlaoise to Carlow The responsibility for speeding traffic rests with the guards.</i>

hedge	Hinder or restrict with or as if with a hedge. <i>The cathedral is closely hedged in by other buildings.</i>
helmet	A hard or padded protective hat, various types of which are worn by soldiers, police officers, motorcyclists, sports players, and others.
lancet	A lancet arch or window. <i>A lancet clock.</i>
organized	Formed into a structured or coherent whole. <i>About 100 cyclists took part in the ride as part of organized protests over the dangers cyclists face on the road.</i>
protect	Use tariffs to favor domestic industry. <i>He tried to protect Kelly from the attack.</i>
protection	Protection money paid to criminals especially on a regular basis. <i>Protection money.</i>
protege	A person who receives support and protection from an influential patron who furthers the protege's career.
safeguard	A document or escort providing safe passage through a region especially in time of war. <i>A framework which safeguards employees from exploitation.</i>
safely	Without being injured or harmed. <i>There is a memento she keeps safely stored away.</i>
<u>security</u>	A department responsible for the security of the institution's property and workers. <i>Military security has been stepped up since the recent uprising.</i>
<u>shield</u>	A sporting trophy shaped like a shield consisting of an engraved metal plate mounted on a piece of wood. <i>The rocks she sat behind shielded her from the lodge.</i>
<u>sword</u>	A cutting or thrusting weapon that has a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard. <i>Not many perished by the sword.</i>
tenable	Based on sound reasoning or evidence. <i>Such a simplistic approach is no longer tenable.</i>
<u>territorial</u>	Nonprofessional soldier member of a territorial military unit. <i>A bizarre territorial rite.</i>
<u>ward</u>	Admit to or care for in a hospital ward. <i>A children's ward.</i>
watchman	A guard who keeps watch. <i>A night watchman.</i>

- windshield** Transparent screen (as of glass) to protect occupants of a vehicle.
