Synonyms of "Aesthete" as a noun (7 Words)

beau	A rich, fashionable young man; a dandy.
dandy	A sailing vessel with two masts; a small mizzen is aft of the rudderpost. <i>The Winchester Model 37 shotgun is a dandy at a low price.</i>
esthete	One who professes great sensitivity to the beauty of art and nature.
fop	A man who is much concerned with his dress and appearance.
glamour boy	Offensive and disparaging term for Black man.
man about town	A manservant who acts as a personal attendant to his employer.
rake	An implement similar to a rake used for other purposes e g by a croupier drawing in money at a gaming table. <i>Giving the lawn a rake.</i>



Associations of "Aesthete" (30 Words)

anthology	A collection of selected literary passages. <i>An anthology of European poetry.</i>
author	Be the author of a book or piece of writing. <i>The concept has been authored largely by insurance companies.</i>
bard	Shakespeare. <i>Our national bard Robert Burns.</i>
biographer	Someone who writes an account of a person's life. <i>An important biographer of contemporary artists.</i>
comic	A professional performer who tells jokes and performs comical acts. <i>The shop sold newspapers and children s comics.</i>
critic	A person who expresses an unfavourable opinion of something. <i>Critics of the new legislation say it is too broad.</i>
dandy	Relating to or characteristic of a dandy. <i>His floppy handkerchiefs and antique cufflinks gave him the look of a dandy.</i>
dramatist	Someone who writes plays.
editor	A program designed to perform such editorial functions as rearrangement or modification or deletion of data. <i>You will be able to use the editor to make any changes you want.</i>
epigram	A witty saying. <i>A Wildean epigram.</i>
famous	Excellent. <i>A famous actor.</i>
journalist	Someone who keeps a diary or journal. <i>Foreign journalists had been expelled from the area.</i>
leaflet	Distribute leaflets to people or an area. <i>Election leaflets.</i>
lyricist	A person who writes the words to a popular song or musical.
minstrel	A performer in a minstrel show. <i>They listened to the minstrels singing songs of knightly prowess.</i>
novelist	One who writes novels.
ode	A lyric poem, typically one in the form of an address to a particular subject, written in varied or irregular metre.
opus	A musical work that has been created. <i>He was writing an opus on Mexico.</i>

pamphleteer	A writer of pamphlets (usually taking a partisan stand on public issues). <i>The right to pamphleteer and post bills anonymously is as important today as it was three centuries ago.</i>
pen	An electronic device like a pen used in conjunction with a writing surface to enter commands or data into a computer. <i>Olivia penned award winning poetry.</i>
playwright	A person who writes plays.
poet	A writer of poems the term is usually reserved for writers of good poetry. <i>He is more poet than academic because of his gift for language.</i>
poetics	The art of writing poetry. <i>Both poetics and rhetoric make use of narrative structure.</i>
<u>prose</u>	Compose in or convert into prose. <i>A prose passage.</i>
quatrain	A stanza of four lines.
rhyme	Compose rhymes. <i>Gravel can be interpreted as an absurd rhyme for travel.</i>
sonnet	Celebrate in a sonnet. <i>And in delightful Tones sit sonneting.</i>
tragedian	An actor who specializes in tragic roles.
<u>write</u>	Create code write a computer program. <i>Thank you and goodbye I ll write soon.</i>
<u>writer</u>	Writes (books or stories or articles or the like) professionally (for pay). <i>A writer of short stories.</i>
