<b>amicability</b>	Having a disposition characterized by warmth and friendliness.
<b>amity</b>	Friendly relations. <i>The presence of French troops in Scotland had produced hostility rather than <b>amity</b>.</i>
<a href="#">benign</a>	Pleasant and beneficial in nature or influence. <i><b>Benign</b> intentions.</i>

<b>chivalrous</b>	Being attentive to women like an ideal knight. <i>Shall I be <b>chivalrous</b> and offer you my coat.</i>
<b>civility</b>	Formal or perfunctory politeness. <i>I hope we can treat each other with <b>civility</b> and respect.</i>
<b>companionable</b>	Suggestive of companionship. <i>A <b>companionable</b> pet.</i>
<b>congenial</b>	(used of plants) capable of cross-fertilization or of being grafted. <i>He went back to a climate more <b>congenial</b> to his cold stony soul.</i>
<b>cordial</b>	Strongly felt. <i>A <b>cordial</b> greeting.</i>
<b>courteous</b>	Exhibiting courtesy and politeness. <i>She was <b>courteous</b> and obliging to all.</i>
<b>courtesy</b>	A polite remark or considerate act. <i>Links to the manufacturers websites are provided as a <b>courtesy</b> to the user.</i>
<b>curtsy</b>	Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect. <i>She bobbed a <b>curtsy</b> to him.</i>
<b>extroverted</b>	Not introspective; examining what is outside yourself. <i>She is <b>extroverted</b> confident and gives rousing lectures.</i>
<b>favor</b>	A feeling of favorable regard. <i>The outcome was in his <b>favor</b>.</i>
<b>favorable</b>	Tending to promote or facilitate. <i>He received a <b>favorable</b> rating.</i>
<b>friendly</b>	Not seriously or unpleasantly competitive or divisive. <i>User <b>friendly</b> computers.</i>
<b>genial</b>	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>A <b>genial</b> host.</i>
<b>goodwill</b>	(accounting) an intangible asset valued according to the advantage or reputation a business has acquired (over and above its tangible assets). <i>A <b>goodwill</b> gesture.</i>
<b>gracious</b>	Characterized by kindness and warm courtesy especially of a king to his subjects. <i>A <b>gracious</b> hostess.</i>
<b>gregarious</b>	(of plants) growing in groups that are close together. <i><b>Gregarious</b> species forage in flocks from colonies or roosts.</i>
<b>kind</b>	Character or nature. <i>All <b>kinds</b> of music.</i>

<b>kindly</b>	Please (used in a polite request or demand, often ironically). <i>A <b>kindly</b> act.</i>
<b>kindness</b>	A kind act. <i>It would be a <b>kindness</b> on your part to invite her.</i>
<b>nice</b>	Giving pleasure or satisfaction; pleasant or attractive. <i>A <b>nice</b> day.</i>
<b>obliging</b>	Willing to do a service or kindness; helpful. <i>It s very <b>obliging</b> of him.</i>
<b>outgoing</b>	A person's regular expenditure. <i>An <b>outgoing</b> steamship.</i>
<b>pleasant</b>	Affording pleasure; being in harmony with your taste or likings. <i>A <b>pleasant</b> scene.</i>
<b>propitious</b>	Presenting favorable circumstances; likely to result in or show signs of success. <i>The timing for such a meeting seemed <b>propitious</b>.</i>
<b>respectfully</b>	In a respectful manner. <i>The butler bowed <b>respectfully</b> to them both.</i>
<b>sociable</b>	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity. <i>A very <b>sociable</b> little village.</i>
