amiable	Having or displaying a friendly and pleasant manner. <i>An amiable villain with a cocky sidelong grin.</i>
amicability	Having a disposition characterized by warmth and friendliness.
amity	Friendly relations. <i>The presence of French troops in Scotland had produced hostility rather than amity.</i>
benign	Pleasant and beneficial in nature or influence. <i>Benign intentions.</i>

<u>chivalrous</u>	Being attentive to women like an ideal knight. <i>Shall I be chivalrous and offer you my coat.</i>
<u>civility</u>	Formal or perfunctory politeness. <i>I hope we can treat each other with civility and respect.</i>
companionable	Suggestive of companionship. <i>A companionable pet.</i>
<u>congenial</u>	(used of plants) capable of cross-fertilization or of being grafted. <i>He went back to a climate more congenial to his cold stony soul.</i>
cordial	Strongly felt. <i>A cordial greeting.</i>
<u>courteous</u>	Exhibiting courtesy and politeness. <i>She was courteous and obliging to all.</i>
<u>courtesy</u>	A polite remark or considerate act. <i>Links to the manufacturers websites are provided as a courtesy to the user.</i>
curtsy	Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect. <i>She bobbed a curtsy to him.</i>
extroverted	Not introspective; examining what is outside yourself. <i>She is extroverted confident and gives rousing lectures.</i>
<u>favor</u>	A feeling of favorable regard. <i>The outcome was in his favor.</i>
<u>favorable</u>	Tending to promote or facilitate. <i>He received a favorable rating.</i>
friendly	Not seriously or unpleasantly competitive or divisive. <i>User friendly computers.</i>
<u>genial</u>	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>A genial host.</i>
goodwill	(accounting) an intangible asset valued according to the advantage or reputation a business has acquired (over and above its tangible assets). <i>A goodwill gesture.</i>
<u>gracious</u>	Characterized by kindness and warm courtesy especially of a king to his subjects. <i>A gracious hostess.</i>
<u>gregarious</u>	(of plants) growing in groups that are close together. <i>Gregarious species forage in flocks from colonies or roosts.</i>
kind	Character or nature. <i>All kinds of music.</i>

kindly	Please (used in a polite request or demand, often ironically). <i>A kindly act.</i>
kindness	A kind act. <i>It would be a kindness on your part to invite her.</i>
nice	Giving pleasure or satisfaction; pleasant or attractive. <i>A nice day.</i>
obliging	Willing to do a service or kindness; helpful. <i>It s very obliging of him.</i>
outgoing	A person's regular expenditure. <i>An outgoing steamship.</i>
pleasant	Affording pleasure; being in harmony with your taste or likings. <i>A pleasant scene.</i>
propitious	Presenting favorable circumstances; likely to result in or show signs of success. <i>The timing for such a meeting seemed propitious.</i>
respectfully	In a respectful manner. <i>The butler bowed respectfully to them both.</i>
sociable	A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity. <i>A very sociable little village.</i>
