A polite remark or considerate act.

user.

curtsy Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect.

She bobbed a curtsy to him.

extroverted Not introspective; examining what is outside yourself.

She is **extroverted** confident and gives rousing lectures.
