<b>band together with</b>	Attach a ring to the foot of, in order to identify.
<b>be in league with</b>	Have life, be alive.
<b>become a member of</b>	Undergo a change or development.
<b><u>bound</u></b>	Of an object rebound from a surface. <i>Bullets <b>bounded</b> off the veranda.</i>
<b>coalesce with</b>	Fuse or cause to grow together.
<b>combine with</b>	Mix together different elements.
<b>confederate with</b>	Form a group or unite.
<b><u>consort</u></b>	Go together. <i>It did not <b>consort</b> with his idea of scientific government.</i>
<b>contribute to</b>	Contribute to some cause.
<b>cooperate with</b>	Work together on a common enterprise of project.
<b>federate with</b>	Unite on a federal basis or band together as a league.
<b>federated</b>	Unite on a federal basis or band together as a league.
<b>form a confederation with</b>	Assume a form or shape.
<b>form a federation with</b>	Assume a form or shape.
<b>form an alliance with</b>	Give shape or form to.
<b>get involved in</b>	Reach by calculation.
<b>have a hand in</b>	Cause to do; cause to act in a specified manner.
<b>help in</b>	Improve; change for the better.
<b>join forces with</b>	Become part of; become a member of a group or organization.
<b>join in</b>	Be or become joined or united or linked.
<b>join up with</b>	Cause to become joined or linked.
<b>join with</b>	Come into the company of.
<b>joined</b>	Cause to become joined or linked.
<b>merge with</b>	Mix together different elements.
<b>participate in</b>	Share in something.
<b>team up with</b>	Form a team.
<b>unite with</b>	Join or combine.

<b>combine</b>	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>A new product which <b>combines</b> the benefits of a hairspray and a gel.</i>
<b>combined</b>	Made or joined or united into one.
<b><u>companion</u></b>	Be a companion to somebody. <i>He is <b>companioned</b> by a pageboy.</i>
<b>confederacy</b>	A union of political organizations. <i>The Yakuza is a secret <b>confederacy</b> of criminal fraternities.</i>
<b>conjoin</b>	Make contact or come together. <i>An approach which <b>conjoins</b> theory and method.</i>
<b><u>consort</u></b>	Agree or be in harmony with. <i>Queen Victoria and her <b>consort</b> Prince Albert.</i>
<b>correlation</b>	A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>There was no <b>correlation</b> between the number of visits to the clinic and the treatment outcome.</i>
<b><u>couple</u></b>	A small indefinite number. <i>This fact is <b>coupled</b> to the other one.</i>
<b>federate</b>	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>In 1901 the six colonies <b>federated</b> to form the Commonwealth of Australia.</i>
<b><u>friendship</u></b>	The state of being friends (or friendly). <i>She formed close <b>friendships</b> with women.</i>
<b><u>fusion</u></b>	The act of fusing (or melting) together. <i><b>Fusion</b> cuisine.</i>
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>Cities efforts to <b>integrate</b>.</i>
<b>integrated</b>	Formed into a whole or introduced into another entity. <i>An <b>integrated</b> public transport system.</i>
<b>marry</b>	Join together; combine harmoniously. <i>Eric asked me to <b>marry</b> him.</i>
<b>mate</b>	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>Camels hate leaving their <b>mates</b>.</i>
<b><u>partner</u></b>	A person s partner in marriage. <i>Sexual <b>partners</b>.</i>

<b>partnership</b>	A cooperative relationship between people or groups who agree to share responsibility for achieving some specific goal. <i>We should go on working together in <b>partnership</b>.</i>

<u><b>spouse</b></u>	A person's partner in marriage.
<b>synthesis</b>	The production of chemical compounds by reaction from simpler materials. <i>The <b>synthesis</b> of intellect and emotion in his work.</i>
<u><b>unify</b></u>	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>Opposition groups struggling to <b>unify</b> around the goal of replacing the regime.</i>
<u><b>union</b></u>	The operation of forming a union. <i>There is strength in <b>union</b>.</i>
<b>unite</b>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>She <b>unites</b> charm with a good business sense.</i>
