- *A subsidiary or subordinate organization that is affiliated with another organization.*

Become an ally or associate, as by a treaty or marriage.

To bring or combine together or with something else.

Bring or come into association or action.

Make a logical or causal connection.

band together with	Attach a ring to the foot of, in order to identify.
be in league with	Have life, be alive.
become a member of	Undergo a change or development.
<u>bound</u>	Of an object rebound from a surface. <i>Bullets bounded off the veranda.</i>
coalesce with	Fuse or cause to grow together.
combine with	Mix together different elements.
confederate with	Form a group or unite.

combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>A new product which combines the benefits of a hairspray and a gel.</i>
combined	Made or joined or united into one.
<u>companion</u>	Be a companion to somebody. <i>He is companioned by a pageboy.</i>
confederacy	A union of political organizations. <i>The Yakuza is a secret confederacy of criminal fraternities.</i>
conjoin	Make contact or come together. <i>An approach which conjoins theory and method.</i>
<u>consort</u>	Agree or be in harmony with. <i>Queen Victoria and her consort Prince Albert.</i>
correlation	A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>There was no correlation between the number of visits to the clinic and the treatment outcome.</i>
<u>couple</u>	A small indefinite number. <i>This fact is coupled to the other one.</i>
federate	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>In 1901 the six colonies federated to form the Commonwealth of Australia.</i>
<u>friendship</u>	The state of being friends (or friendly). <i>She formed close friendships with women.</i>
<u>fusion</u>	The act of fusing (or melting) together. <i>Fusion cuisine.</i>
integrate	Become one become integrated. <i>Cities efforts to integrate.</i>
integrated	Formed into a whole or introduced into another entity. <i>An integrated public transport system.</i>
marry	Join together; combine harmoniously. <i>Eric asked me to marry him.</i>
mate	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>Camels hate leaving their mates.</i>
<u>partner</u>	A person s partner in marriage. <i>Sexual partners.</i>

partnership	A cooperative relationship between people or groups who agree to share responsibility for achieving some specific goal. <i>We should go on working together in partnership.</i>
preempt	Make a preemptive bid in the game of bridge. <i>Live broadcast of the presidential debate preempts the regular news hour.</i>
<u>reunion</u>	A social gathering attended by members of a group of people who have not seen each other for some time. <i>She had a tearful reunion with her parents.</i>
<u>spouse</u>	A person's partner in marriage.
synthesis	The production of chemical compounds by reaction from simpler materials. <i>The synthesis of intellect and emotion in his work.</i>
<u>unify</u>	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>Opposition groups struggling to unify around the goal of replacing the regime.</i>
<u>union</u>	The operation of forming a union. <i>There is strength in union.</i>
unite	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>She unites charm with a good business sense.</i>
