## **Affiliated as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Affiliated" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “affiliated” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a subsidiary group or a person) officially attached or connected to an organization.*
- *Being joined in close association.*



## Synonyms of "Affiliated" as an adjective (2 Words)

**attached** (of an organization) affiliated to (a larger organization).  
*All art schools whether independent or **attached** to universities.*

**connected** Joined or linked together.  
*A **connected** series of cargo holds.*

## Associations of "Affiliated" (30 Words)

<b>attached</b>	Full of affection or fondness. <i>She s cute is she <b>attached</b>.</i>
<b>bilateral</b>	Having two sides or parts. <i>A <b>bilateral</b> agreement between the United States and Japan.</i>
<u><b>closely</b></u>	In a careful and attentive way. <i>The medical sergeant follows <b>closely</b> behind the squad.</i>
<b>connected</b>	Being joined in close association. <i>All the window alarms are <b>connected</b>.</i>
<b>connection</b>	The act of bringing two things into contact (especially for communication). <i>The <b>connections</b> between social attitudes and productivity.</i>
<u><b>correlated</b></u>	Mutually related.
<b>correlative</b>	Either of two or more related or complementary variables. <i>Rights whether moral or legal can involve <b>correlative</b> duties.</i>
<b>corresponding</b>	Accompanying. <i>A number of <b>corresponding</b> diagonal points.</i>



<b><u>friendship</u></b>	A relationship between friends. <i>Because of the <b>friendship</b> between our countries we had a very frank exchange.</i>
<b>hinge</b>	Attach with a hinge. <i>This period can be called the <b>hinge</b> of history.</i>
<b>inextricable</b>	Not permitting extrication; incapable of being disentangled or untied. <i>An <b>inextricable</b> situation.</i>
<b>inherence</b>	The state of inhering; the state of being a fixed characteristic. <i>The <b>inherence</b> of polysemy in human language.</i>
<b>interaction</b>	A mutual or reciprocal action; interacting. <i>For a shy person social <b>interaction</b> can be a stomach churning anxiety filled experience.</i>
<b>interactive</b>	Capable of acting on or influencing each other. <i>A fully <b>interactive</b> map of the area.</i>
<b>interconnect</b>	Be interwoven or interconnected. <i>The lakes are <b>interconnected</b> by trails filled with joggers.</i>
<b><u>interdependent</u></b>	Mutually dependent. <i>We in Europe are all increasingly <b>interdependent</b>.</i>
<b>interlinear</b>	Written or printed between the lines of a text. <i>A Greek English <b>interlinear</b> New Testament.</i>
<b>intimately</b>	In a way that involves detailed knowledge. <i>He is <b>intimately</b> familiar with her work.</i>
<b><u>involved</u></b>	Emotionally involved. <i>A long <b>involved</b> conversation.</i>
<b><u>involvement</u></b>	Emotional or personal association with someone. <i>He escaped <b>involvement</b> in the accident.</i>
<b><u>link</u></b>	The means of connection between things linked in series. <i>A network of routes <b>linking</b> towns and villages.</i>
<b>linked</b>	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<b>loving</b>	Feeling or showing love and affection. <i>A <b>loving</b> father.</i>
<b><u>mutual</u></b>	A mutual building society or insurance company. <i>My father hated him from the start and the feeling was <b>mutual</b>.</i>
<b>positively</b>	So as to be positive; in a positive manner. <i>The negotiations started <b>positively</b> with agreement on several issues.</i>

**rapport**

A close and harmonious relationship in which the people or groups concerned understand each other's feelings or ideas and communicate well.

*She had an instant **rapport** with animals.*

**reciprocal**

One of a pair of numbers whose product is 1 the reciprocal of  $\frac{2}{3}$  is  $\frac{3}{2}$  the multiplicative inverse of 7 is  $\frac{1}{7}$ .

**Reciprocal** trade.

**related**

Associated with the specified item or process, especially causally.

*Income **related** benefits.*

**relation**

The principle that an act done at a later time is deemed by law to have occurred at an earlier time.

*The meetings helped cement Anglo American **relations**.*

**relatively**

Regarded in comparison with something else rather than absolutely; quite.

*The situation is **relatively** calm now.*
