
Definitions of "Affinity" as a noun

- A natural attraction or feeling of kinship.
- *Kinship by marriage or adoption; not a blood relationship.*
- The attraction between an antigen and an antibody.
- (anthropology) kinship by marriage or adoption; not a blood relationship.
- A similarity of characteristics suggesting a relationship, especially a resemblance in structure between animals, plants, or languages.
- A close connection marked by community of interests or similarity in nature or character.
- A natural liking for and understanding of someone or something.
- Relationship, especially by marriage as opposed to blood ties.
- The degree to which a substance tends to combine with another.
- (biology) state of relationship between organisms or groups of organisms resulting in resemblance in structure or structural parts.
- State of relationship between organisms or groups of organisms resulting in resemblance in structure or structural parts.



- (immunology) the attraction between an antigen and an antibody.
- The force attracting atoms to each other and binding them together in a molecule.
- Inherent resemblance between persons or things.
