<u>affidavit</u>	A written statement confirmed by oath or affirmation, for use as evidence in court. A former employee swore an <b>affidavit</b> relating to his claim for unfair
	dismissal.
<u>assert</u>	Assert to be true. The company <b>assert</b> s that the cuts will not affect development.
asserting	Relating to the use of or having the nature of a declaration.
assertion	A declaration that is made emphatically (as if no supporting evidence were necessary. The <b>assertion</b> of his legal rights.
assurance	Confidence or certainty in one's own abilities. The President s <b>assurance</b> s were not respected.
<u>assure</u>	Assure somebody of the truth of something with the intention of giving the listener confidence. <i>You would be <b>assure</b>d of a welcome.</i>
<u>aver</u>	Allege as a fact in support of a plea. <i>He <b>aver</b>red that he was innocent of the allegations.</i>
avow	Admit openly and bluntly; make no bones about. <i>He <b>avow</b>ed his change of faith.</i>
<u>certain</u>	Certain to occur destined or inevitable Benjamin Franklin. Be <b>certain</b> to disconnect the iron when you are through.
claim	Ask for legally or make a legal claim to as of debts for example. <i>The accident <b>claim</b>ed three lives.</i>
confidently	In a way that expresses little or no doubt about something. I strode <b>confidently</b> up to the rope.
confirm	Administer the religious rite of confirmation to. <i>He had been baptized and <b>confirm</b>ed.</i>



<u>conjunction</u>	The grammatical relation between linguistic units words or phrases or clauses that are connected by a conjunction. The <b>conjunctions</b> and oppositions of the planets.
declarative	Relating to the mood of verbs that is used simple in declarative statements. <b>Declarative</b> statements.
declaratory	Relating to the use of or having the nature of a declaration. A <b>declaratory</b> ruling in favour of the applicants.
<u>declare</u>	Declare to be. Pakistan <b>declare</b> d at 446 for four.
exaction	Act of demanding or levying by force or authority. <i>Exaction</i> of various dues and fees.
faithfully	In a loyal manner. She translated the novel as <b>faithfully</b> as possible.
<u>indicative</u>	The indicative mood. Having recurrent dreams is not necessarily <b>indicative</b> of any psychological problem.
noun	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
<u>predicate</u>	One of the two main constituents of a sentence the predicate contains the verb and its complements. Socrates is a man <b>predicates</b> manhood of Socrates.
<u>proclaim</u>	Affirm or declare as an attribute or quality of. She <b>proclaim</b> ed that what I had said was untrue.
<u>purport</u>	The intended meaning of a communication. She is not the person she <b>purport</b> s to be.
say	Have or contain a certain wording or form. The registrar <b>say</b> s that I owe the school money.
statement	(computer science) a line of code written as part of a computer program. The hope is that they will fill the stands and terraces to make a <b>statement</b> about the importance of this club.
<u>substantiate</u>	Provide evidence to support or prove the truth of. The painting <b>substantiate</b> s the feelings of the artist.
swear	An offensive word used especially to express anger a swear word. Maria made me <b>swear</b> I would never tell anyone.
verb	Use a word that is not conventionally used as a verb typically a noun as a verb. Any English noun can be <b>verb</b> ed but some are more resistant than others.



verify	Check or regulate (a scientific experiment) by conducting a parallel experiment or comparing with another standard. <i>Please verify that the doors are closed.</i>
vow	Make a vow promise. I <b>vow</b> ed that my family would never go hungry.
