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## Associations of "Affirming" (30 Words)

<b>affidavit</b>	A written statement confirmed by oath or affirmation, for use as evidence in court. <i>A former employee swore an <b>affidavit</b> relating to his claim for unfair dismissal.</i>
<b>assert</b>	Assert to be true. <i>The company <b>asserts</b> that the cuts will not affect development.</i>
<b>asserting</b>	Relating to the use of or having the nature of a declaration.
<b>assertion</b>	A declaration that is made emphatically (as if no supporting evidence were necessary). <i>The <b>assertion</b> of his legal rights.</i>
<b>assurance</b>	Confidence or certainty in one's own abilities. <i>The President's <b>assurances</b> were not respected.</i>
<b>assure</b>	Assure somebody of the truth of something with the intention of giving the listener confidence. <i>You would be <b>assured</b> of a welcome.</i>
<b>aver</b>	Allege as a fact in support of a plea. <i>He <b>averred</b> that he was innocent of the allegations.</i>
<b>avow</b>	Admit openly and bluntly; make no bones about. <i>He <b>avowed</b> his change of faith.</i>
<b>certain</b>	Certain to occur destined or inevitable Benjamin Franklin. <i>Be <b>certain</b> to disconnect the iron when you are through.</i>
<b>claim</b>	Ask for legally or make a legal claim to as of debts for example. <i>The accident <b>claimed</b> three lives.</i>
<b>confidently</b>	In a way that expresses little or no doubt about something. <i>I strode <b>confidently</b> up to the rope.</i>
<b>confirm</b>	Administer the religious rite of confirmation to. <i>He had been baptized and <b>confirmed</b>.</i>

<b><u>conjunction</u></b>	The grammatical relation between linguistic units words or phrases or clauses that are connected by a conjunction. <i>The <b>conjunctions</b> and <b>oppositions</b> of the planets.</i>
<b>declarative</b>	Relating to the mood of verbs that is used simple in declarative statements. <i><b>Declarative</b> statements.</i>
<b>declaratory</b>	Relating to the use of or having the nature of a declaration. <i>A <b>declaratory</b> ruling in favour of the applicants.</i>
<b><u>declare</u></b>	Declare to be. <i>Pakistan <b>declared</b> at 446 for four.</i>
<b>exaction</b>	Act of demanding or levying by force or authority. <i><b>Exaction</b> of various dues and fees.</i>
<b>faithfully</b>	In a loyal manner. <i>She translated the novel as <b>faithfully</b> as possible.</i>
<b><u>indicative</u></b>	The indicative mood. <i>Having recurrent dreams is not necessarily <b>indicative</b> of any psychological problem.</i>
<b>noun</b>	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
<b><u>predicate</u></b>	One of the two main constituents of a sentence the predicate contains the verb and its complements. <i>Socrates is a man <b>predicates</b> manhood of Socrates.</i>
<b><u>proclaim</u></b>	Affirm or declare as an attribute or quality of. <i>She <b>proclaimed</b> that what I had said was untrue.</i>
<b><u>purport</u></b>	The intended meaning of a communication. <i>She is not the person she <b>purports</b> to be.</i>
<b>say</b>	Have or contain a certain wording or form. <i>The registrar <b>says</b> that I owe the school money.</i>
<b>statement</b>	(computer science) a line of code written as part of a computer program. <i>The hope is that they will fill the stands and terraces to make a <b>statement</b> about the importance of this club.</i>
<b><u>substantiate</u></b>	Provide evidence to support or prove the truth of. <i>The painting <b>substantiates</b> the feelings of the artist.</i>
<b>swear</b>	An offensive word used especially to express anger a swear word. <i>Maria made me <b>swear</b> I would never tell anyone.</i>
<b>verb</b>	Use a word that is not conventionally used as a verb typically a noun as a verb. <i>Any English noun can be <b>verbed</b> but some are more resistant than others.</i>

Check or regulate (a scientific experiment) by conducting a parallel experiment or comparing with another standard.

*Please **verify** that the doors are closed.*

**vow**

Make a vow promise.

*I **vowed** that my family would never go hungry.*
