### **Definitions of "Affix" as a verb**

- *Stick, attach, or fasten (something) to something else.*
- *Add to the very end.*
- *Attach to.*
- *Attach or become attached to a stem word.*

- add** Put in an additional element ingredient etc.  
*The music **added** a lot to the play.*
- add on** Determine the sum of.
- append** Add (something) to the end of a written document.  
*The results of the survey are **appended** to this chapter.*
- attach** Be attached be in contact with.  
*The Commission can **attach** appropriate conditions to the operation of the agreement.*
- bind** Provide with a binding.  
*A protein in a form that can **bind** DNA.*
- connect** Make a logical or causal connection.  
*All the buildings are **connected** by underground passages.*
- couple** Form a pair or pairs.  
*A sense of hope is **coupled** with a palpable sense of loss.*

<b>fasten</b>	Become fixed or fastened. <i>They <b>fastened</b> various nicknames to each other.</i>
<b>fix</b>	Make fixed stable or stationary. <i><b>Fix</b> a race.</i>
<b>join</b>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>She <b>joined</b> the department last year.</i>
<b>post</b>	Assign to a post put into a post. <i>We have <b>posted</b> all the bars.</i>
<b>secure</b>	Get by special effort. <i>A loan <b>secured</b> on your home.</i>
<b>stick</b>	Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist separation. <i><b>Stick</b> the photo onto the corkboard.</i>
<b>stick on</b>	Stick to firmly.
<b>supplement</b>	Serve as a supplement to. <i>Vitamins <b>supplemented</b> his meager diet.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Affix" as a verb

- Grammatical morphemes *affix to the stem.*
- The strings *affix to the back of the bridge.*
- Panels to which he *affixes* copies of fine old prints.
- *Affix the seal here.*



## Associations of "Affix" (30 Words)

### adhere

Come or be in close contact with; stick or hold together and resist separation.

*Paint won't **adhere** well to a greasy surface.*

### adhesive

A substance used for sticking objects or materials together; glue.

*Tile **adhesive**.*

### ally

Become an ally or associate as by a treaty or marriage.

*He's a good **ally** in fight.*

<b>append</b>	Fix to; attach. <i>He <b>appended</b> a glossary to his novel where he used an invented language.</i>
<b>attach</b>	Cause to be attached. <i>The spider s thread <b>attached</b> to the window sill.</i>
<b>bracket</b>	Support with brackets. <i>Symbols are given in <b>brackets</b>.</i>
<b>cling</b>	A clingstone peach. <i>You are <b>clinging</b> to him for security.</i>
<b>combine</b>	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>One of the world s biggest food and personal products <b>combines</b>.</i>
<b>commingle</b>	Mix together different elements. <i>His book <b>commingles</b> sarcasm and sadness.</i>
<b>communicate</b>	Impart or pass on (information, news, or ideas). <i>The ability of good teachers to <b>communicate</b> their own enthusiasm.</i>
<b>connect</b>	Make a logical or causal connection. <i>The President of this university really <b>connects</b> with the faculty.</i>
<b>correlation</b>	A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>The increasingly similar basis underlying national soil maps allows <b>correlation</b> to take place more easily.</i>
<b>decal</b>	A design prepared on special paper for durable transfer on to another surface such as glass or porcelain.
<b>exhibit</b>	Give an exhibition of to an interested audience. <i>Many <b>exhibits</b> including the cockpit voice recordings will be produced in court.</i>
<b>fix</b>	Make fixed stable or stationary. <i>That ll <b>fix</b> him good.</i>
<b>flexibly</b>	With flexibility. <i>Most women who have children want to work <b>flexibly</b>.</i>
<b>glue</b>	Join or attach with or as if with glue. <i>What is the <b>glue</b> that holds companies together.</i>
<b>graft</b>	Insert a shoot or twig as a graft. <i><b>Graft</b> the cherry tree branch onto the plum tree.</i>
<b>join</b>	Cause to become joined or linked. <i>The two roads <b>join</b> here.</i>

<a href="#"><u>link</u></a>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>Rumours that <b>linked</b> his name with Judith.</i>
<b>nexus</b>	A central or focal point. <i>The <b>nexus</b> between industry and political power.</i>
<a href="#"><u>relate</u></a>	Be causally connected. <i>The study examines social change within the city and <b>relates</b> it to developments in the country as a whole.</i>
<a href="#"><u>respond</u></a>	Respond favorably or as hoped. <i>The cancer <b>responded</b> to the aggressive therapy.</i>
<b>seal</b>	An engraved device used for stamping a seal. <i>Many fittings have tapered threads for a better <b>seal</b>.</i>
<b>stamp</b>	A mark or pattern made by a stamp especially one indicating official validation. <i>A man whose name is permanently <b>stamped</b> on our maps.</i>
<b>sticker</b>	A small sharp-pointed tip resembling a spike on a stem or leaf. <i>She s a <b>sticker</b>.</i>
<b>supplement</b>	Add as a supplement to what seems insufficient. <i>Our special <b>supplement</b> is packed with ideas for healthy hair.</i>
<a href="#"><u>tie</u></a>	A cord or string or ribbon or wire etc with which something is tied. <i>It is important that we keep family <b>ties</b> strong.</i>
<b>undergird</b>	Lend moral support to. <i><b>Undergird</b> the ship.</i>
<b>windshield</b>	Transparent screen (as of glass) to protect occupants of a vehicle.
