- *Attach or become attached to a stem word.*

- add** Put in an additional element ingredient etc.
*The music **added** a lot to the play.*
- add on** Determine the sum of.
- append** Add (something) to the end of a written document.
*The results of the survey are **appended** to this chapter.*
- attach** Be attached be in contact with.
*The Commission can **attach** appropriate conditions to the operation of the agreement.*
- bind** Provide with a binding.
*A protein in a form that can **bind** DNA.*
- connect** Make a logical or causal connection.
*All the buildings are **connected** by underground passages.*
- couple** Form a pair or pairs.
*A sense of hope is **coupled** with a palpable sense of loss.*

fasten	Become fixed or fastened. <i>They fastened various nicknames to each other.</i>
fix	Make fixed stable or stationary. <i>Fix a race.</i>
join	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>She joined the department last year.</i>
post	Assign to a post put into a post. <i>We have posted all the bars.</i>
secure	Get by special effort. <i>A loan secured on your home.</i>
stick	Come or be in close contact with stick or hold together and resist separation. <i>Stick the photo onto the corkboard.</i>
stick on	Stick to firmly.
supplement	Serve as a supplement to. <i>Vitamins supplemented his meager diet.</i>



Usage Examples of "Affix" as a verb

- Grammatical morphemes *affix to the stem.*
- The strings *affix to the back of the bridge.*
- Panels to which he *affixes* copies of fine old prints.
- *Affix the seal here.*



Associations of "Affix" (30 Words)

adhere

Come or be in close contact with; stick or hold together and resist separation.

*Paint won't **adhere** well to a greasy surface.*

adhesive

A substance used for sticking objects or materials together; glue.

*Tile **adhesive**.*

ally

Become an ally or associate as by a treaty or marriage.

*He's a good **ally** in fight.*

append	Fix to; attach. <i>He appended a glossary to his novel where he used an invented language.</i>
attach	Cause to be attached. <i>The spider s thread attached to the window sill.</i>
bracket	Support with brackets. <i>Symbols are given in brackets.</i>
cling	A clingstone peach. <i>You are clinging to him for security.</i>
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>One of the world s biggest food and personal products combines.</i>
commingle	Mix together different elements. <i>His book commingles sarcasm and sadness.</i>
communicate	Impart or pass on (information, news, or ideas). <i>The ability of good teachers to communicate their own enthusiasm.</i>
connect	Make a logical or causal connection. <i>The President of this university really connects with the faculty.</i>
correlation	A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>The increasingly similar basis underlying national soil maps allows correlation to take place more easily.</i>
decal	A design prepared on special paper for durable transfer on to another surface such as glass or porcelain.
exhibit	Give an exhibition of to an interested audience. <i>Many exhibits including the cockpit voice recordings will be produced in court.</i>
fix	Make fixed stable or stationary. <i>That ll fix him good.</i>
flexibly	With flexibility. <i>Most women who have children want to work flexibly.</i>
glue	Join or attach with or as if with glue. <i>What is the glue that holds companies together.</i>
graft	Insert a shoot or twig as a graft. <i>Graft the cherry tree branch onto the plum tree.</i>
join	Cause to become joined or linked. <i>The two roads join here.</i>

<u>link</u>	Be or become joined or united or linked. <i>Rumours that linked his name with Judith.</i>
nexus	A central or focal point. <i>The nexus between industry and political power.</i>
<u>relate</u>	Be causally connected. <i>The study examines social change within the city and relates it to developments in the country as a whole.</i>
<u>respond</u>	Respond favorably or as hoped. <i>The cancer responded to the aggressive therapy.</i>
seal	An engraved device used for stamping a seal. <i>Many fittings have tapered threads for a better seal.</i>
stamp	A mark or pattern made by a stamp especially one indicating official validation. <i>A man whose name is permanently stamped on our maps.</i>
sticker	A small sharp-pointed tip resembling a spike on a stem or leaf. <i>She s a sticker.</i>
supplement	Add as a supplement to what seems insufficient. <i>Our special supplement is packed with ideas for healthy hair.</i>
<u>tie</u>	A cord or string or ribbon or wire etc with which something is tied. <i>It is important that we keep family ties strong.</i>
undergird	Lend moral support to. <i>Undergird the ship.</i>
windshield	Transparent screen (as of glass) to protect occupants of a vehicle.
