According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "affluent" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(especially of a group or area) having a great deal of money; wealthy.*
- *Having an abundant supply of money or possessions of value.*
- *(of water) flowing freely or in great quantity.*





## Synonyms of "Affluent" as an adjective (11 Words)

<b>comfortable</b>	As large as is needed or wanted. <i>Few of us are <b>comfortable</b> with confrontations.</i>
<b>flush</b>	Of a surface exactly even with an adjoining one, forming the same plane. <i>A door <b>flush</b> with the wall.</i>
<b>loaded</b>	Weighted or biased towards a particular outcome. <i>Anything else It was a <b>loaded</b> question and Kelly knew it.</i>
<b>moneyed</b>	Based on or arising from the possession of money or wealth. <i>The industrial revolution created a new <b>moneyed</b> class.</i>
<b>opulent</b>	Ostentatiously costly and luxurious. <i>The <b>opulent</b> comfort of a limousine.</i>
<b>prosperous</b>	Marked by peace and prosperity. <i>A <b>prosperous</b> new business.</i>

<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A protein <b>rich</b> diet.</i>
<b><u>substantial</u></b>	Of or relating to the real nature or essential elements of something. <i>Several <b>substantial</b> timber buildings.</i>
<b>wealthy</b>	Having a great deal of money, resources, or assets; rich. <i><b>Wealthy</b> corporations.</i>
<b>well off</b>	Resulting favorably.
<b>with deep pockets</b>	Extreme.

<b><u>fertile</u></b>	(of a seed or egg) capable of becoming a new individual. <i><b>Fertile</b> farmland.</i>
<b>fertility</b>	The property of producing abundantly and sustaining vigorous and luxuriant growth. <i>Improve the soil <b>fertility</b> by adding compost.</i>

<b>flourishing</b>	Very lively and profitable. <i>A <b>flourishing</b> career.</i>
<b>galore</b>	In great numbers. <i>There were prizes <b>galore</b> for everything.</i>
<b>mellowness</b>	The property of a sensation that is rich and pleasing. <i>A <b>mellowness</b> of light and shade not attainable in marble.</i>
<b>overflow</b>	Overflow with a certain feeling. <i>An <b>overflow</b> of sewage.</i>
<b>plenitude</b>	The condition of being full or complete. <i>The <b>plenitude</b> of the Pope's powers.</i>
<b>plenteous</b>	Affording an abundant supply. <i>A <b>plenteous</b> grape harvest.</i>
<b>plentiful</b>	Producing in abundance. <i>Coal is cheap and <b>plentiful</b>.</i>
<b>plentitude</b>	A full supply.
<b>plenty</b>	A large number or amount or extent. <i>She has <b>plenty</b> more ideas.</i>
<b>profusion</b>	An abundance or large quantity of something. <i>The <b>profusion</b> of detail.</i>
<b>prolific</b>	Present in large numbers or quantities; plentiful. <i>Mahogany was once <b>prolific</b> in the tropical forests.</i>
<b>prosper</b>	Make steady progress; be at the high point in one's career or reach a high point in historical significance or importance. <i>Areas where grey squirrels cannot <b>prosper</b>.</i>
<b>prosperity</b>	An economic state of growth with rising profits and full employment. <i>A long period of peace and <b>prosperity</b>.</i>
<b>prosperous</b>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck or a good outcome. <i>A <b>prosperous</b> new business.</i>
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>A <b>rich</b> tenor voice.</i>
<b>richness</b>	Abundant wealth. <i>The <b>richness</b> and diversity of human culture.</i>
<b>teem</b>	Be teeming; be abuzz. <i>The plaza is <b>teeming</b> with undercover policemen.</i>
