Definitions of "Afraid" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "afraid" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Filled with regret or concern; used often to soften an unpleasant statement.
- Feeling worry or concern or insecurity.
- Anxious about the well-being or safety of.
- Feeling fear or anxiety; frightened.
- *Unwilling or reluctant to do something for fear of the consequences.*
- Filled with fear or apprehension.
- Having feelings of aversion or unwillingness.
- Worried that something undesirable will occur or be done.

disinclined Unwilling; reluctant.

Disinclined to say anything to anybody.

fearful Feeling or showing fear or anxiety.

Cast **fearful** glances at the large dog.

frightenedThrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.

I m not **frightened** of him.

loath Strongly opposed.

Loath to admit a mistake.

of or relating to the nervous system.

A sensitive **nervous** person.

petrified (of organic matter) changed into a stony substance; ossified.

The **petrified** child clung to her mother.

Unwilling and hesitant; disinclined.

reluctant

They were usually reluctant to socialize.



scared Made afraid.

We re both **scared** of spiders.

scared stiff Made afraid.scared to death Made afraid.

slow Slow to learn or understand lacking intellectual acuity.

She was rather a **slow** reader.

terrifiedThrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.

The **terrified** horse bolted.

Not disposed or inclined toward.

unwilling

An unwilling smile.

- Afraid for his life.
- I am afraid we have witnessed only the first phase of the conflict.
- Afraid of hard work.

Causing extreme fear.

timorous Timid by nature or revealing timidity.
