## Associations of "After all" (30 Words)

<b>afterthought</b>	An addition that was not included in the original plan. <i>As an <b>afterthought</b> she said Thank you.</i>
<a href="#">afterward</a>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>It didn't happen until <b>afterward</b>.</i>
<a href="#">afterwards</a>	At a later or future time. <i>The offender was arrested shortly <b>afterwards</b>.</i>
<b>always</b>	As a last resort; failing all else. <i>She is <b>always</b> making derogatory remarks.</i> Because of the reason given.
<a href="#">consequently</a>	<i>Flexible workers find themselves in great demand and <b>consequently</b> gain high salaries.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	Continuing in time or space without interruption. <i>Lived in <b>continuous</b> fear.</i>
<a href="#">ensuing</a>	Following immediately and as a result of what went before. <i>She lost track of one of her children during the <b>ensuing</b> chaos.</i>
<b>entire</b>	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged. <i>An <b>entire</b> horse.</i>
<b>entirety</b>	The whole of something. <i>She would have to stay in her room for the <b>entirety</b> of the weekend.</i>
<a href="#">ever</a>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Having to borrow <b>ever</b> larger sums.</i>
<a href="#">every</a>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i><b>Every</b> third seat.</i>
<b>following</b>	Immediately following in time or order. <i>He attracted a worldwide <b>following</b>.</i>

<b><u>forever</u></b>	Continually. <i>These puppies need a <b>forever</b> home.</i>
<b><u>frequently</u></b>	Regularly or habitually; often. <i>They go abroad <b>frequently</b>.</i>
<b>generic</b>	Characteristic of or relating to a class or group of things; not specific. <b>Generic</b> dance floor fillers.
<b><u>henceforth</u></b>	From this time forth; from now on. <b>Henceforth</b> she will be known as Mrs Smith.
<b>intermittently</b>	In an intermittent manner. <i>An <b>intermittently</b> amusing plot.</i>
<b>later</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <b>Later</b> medical science could have saved the child.
<b><u>next</u></b>	The next person or thing. <i>The woman in the <b>next</b> room.</i>
<b><u>occasionally</u></b>	Now and then or here and there. <i>Very <b>occasionally</b> the condition can result in death.</i>
<b><u>outright</u></b>	Immediately or instantly. <i>An <b>outright</b> refusal.</i>
<b>permanency</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<b><u>shortly</u></b>	For a short time. <i>To put it <b>shortly</b>.</i>
<b>subsequently</b>	After a particular thing has happened; afterwards. <i>The officer decided to stop and <b>subsequently</b> made an arrest.</i>
<b>successively</b>	In proper order or sequence. <i>He served <b>successively</b> as a major and a lieutenant colonel.</i>
<b><u>then</u></b>	In that case; therefore. <i>So you re still here <b>then</b>.</i>
<b><u>totally</u></b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’). <i>The building was <b>totally</b> destroyed by the fire.</i>
<b><u>utterly</u></b>	Completely and without qualification; absolutely. <i>He looked <b>utterly</b> ridiculous.</i>
<b><u>whole</u></b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly. <i>Europe considered as a <b>whole</b>.</i>

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly.
