lunch Take someone out for lunch.

At what time are you lunching.

lunchtime The time in the middle of the day when lunch is eaten.

The **lunchtime** television news.

midday The middle of the day.

He awoke at **midday**.

midnight Twelve o'clock at night. The midnight hours.

Every morning.

morning They talked until morning.

night A shortening of nightfall. *It vanished into the night.*

The onset of night; dusk.

mightfall We had to get back by nightfall.

noon The middle of the day.

The service starts at twelve **noon**.

o'clock According to the clock.

sunday United States evangelist (1862-1935.

sunny (of a place) receiving much sunlight.

A **sunny** smile.

The time in the morning when the sun appears or full daylight arrives.

High technology **sunrise** industries.

(of a programme, agency, regulation, etc.) expire or be terminated

sunset automatically at the end of a fixed period unless renewed by legislative action.

The wireless service providers that operate these networks are **sunset**ting

them.

thursday The fifth day of the week; the fourth working day.

The next day, the day after, following the present day.

Tomorrow s Grand Prix in Brazil.

tonight On the present or approaching evening or night.

Are you doing anything **tonight**.

tuesday The third day of the week; the second working day.

The period of the evening when twilight is visible between daylight and

twilight darkness.

In the twilight of the empire.

wednesday The fourth day of the week; the third working day.

Any day except Sunday (and sometimes except Saturday. weekday

The **weekday** rush hour.

In the recent past. yesterday
