| accompaniment | A piece of music played as a complement or background to an activity. <i>These biscuits are a lovely accompaniment to tea.</i> |
| appendix | A tube shaped sac attached to and opening into the lower end of the large intestine in humans and some other mammals In humans the appendix is small and has no known function but in rabbits hares and some other herbivores it is involved in the digestion of cellulose. <i>A list of such activities was published as an appendix to the report.</i> |
| coda | The concluding passage of a piece or movement, typically forming an addition to the basic structure. <i>The first movement ends with a fortissimo coda.</i> |
| codicil | An addition or supplement that explains, modifies, or revokes a will or part of one. <i>Francis has remembered him in a codicil to this will.</i> |
| postscript | A note appended to a letter after the signature. <i>As a postscript to this Paul did finally marry.</i> |

| rider | A traveler riding in a vehicle (a boat or bus or car or plane or train etc) who is not operating it. <i>Two riders approached the cottage.</i> |
| supplement | A supplementary component that improves capability. <i>Our special supplement is packed with ideas for healthy hair.</i> |
| tailpiece | The piece at the base of a violin or other stringed instrument to which the strings are attached. <i>There was a tailpiece to the article.</i> |
