### **Definitions of "Agents" as a noun**

- *A substance that exerts some force or effect.*
- *The semantic role of the animate entity that instigates or causes the happening denoted by the verb in the clause.*
- *A representative who acts on behalf of other persons or organizations.*
- *A businessman who buys or sells for another in exchange for a commission.*
- *Any agent or representative of a federal agency or bureau.*
- *An active and efficient cause; capable of producing a certain effect.*



### Synonyms of "Agents" as a noun (4 Words)

**agentive role** What something is used for.

**broker** A person who buys and sells goods or assets for others.  
*The centralized lenders operate through **brokers**.*

**factor** With numeral a sunscreen of the sun protection factor specified.  
*A number of **factors** determined the outcome.*

**federal agent** A member of the Union Army during the American Civil War.

## Associations of "Agents" (30 Words)

<b>alternate</b>	Be an understudy or alternate for a role. <i><b>Alternate</b> bouts of intense labour and of idleness.</i>
<b>alternative</b>	One of a number of things from which only one can be chosen. <i>Audiobooks are an interesting <b>alternative</b> to reading.</i>
<b>bail</b>	Release or secure the release of a prisoner on payment of bail. <i>He has been released on <b>bail</b>.</i>
<b>dealer</b>	Someone who purchases and maintains an inventory of goods to be sold. <i>A <b>dealer</b> in stolen goods.</i>
<b>deputy</b>	Someone authorized to exercise the powers of sheriff in emergencies. <i>His <b>deputy</b> has been largely running the business for the past year.</i>
<b>disinfectant</b>	Preventing infection by inhibiting the growth or action of microorganisms. <i>All surfaces are cleaned manually or by pressure washer with <b>disinfectant</b>.</i>
<b>displace</b>	Cause to move, usually with force or pressure. <i>His aides were discredited and <b>displaced</b>.</i>
<b>employment</b>	The occupation for which you are paid. <i>A fall in the numbers in full time <b>employment</b>.</i>
<b>exchange</b>	Exchange a penalty for a less severe one. <i>An <b>exchange</b> visit to Germany.</i>
<b>fungible</b>	A commodity that is freely interchangeable with another in satisfying an obligation. <i>It is by no means the world s only <b>fungible</b> commodity.</i>
<b>indirect</b>	Not directly caused by or resulting from something. <i>He took a careful <b>indirect</b> route home from his dockside rendezvous.</i>
<b>instead</b>	On the contrary. <i>He didn t call rather or <b>instead</b> he wrote her a letter.</i>
<b>interchange</b>	A road junction designed on several levels so that traffic streams do not intersect. <i>The <b>interchange</b> of woods and meadows.</i>
<b>intermediary</b>	A negotiator who acts as a link between parties. <i>An <b>intermediary</b> stage.</i>
<b>permutation</b>	Each of several possible ways in which a set or number of things can be ordered or arranged. <i>His thoughts raced ahead to fifty different <b>permutations</b> of what he must do.</i>

<b>proxy</b>	A person authorized to act on behalf of another. <i>The use of a US wealth measure as a <b>proxy</b> for the true worldwide measure.</i>
<b>recruiter</b>	An official who enlists personnel for military service. <i>A <b>recruiter</b> will schedule you for an interview.</i>
<b>replace</b>	Put in the place of another; switch seemingly equivalent items. <i>Mary <b>replaced</b> Susan as the team's captain and the highest ranked player in the school.</i>
<b>replacement</b>	The action or process of replacing someone or something. <i>Please stay until we find a <b>replacement</b> for you.</i>
<b>representative</b>	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>Fossil <b>representatives</b> of lampreys and hagfishes.</i>
<u><a href="#">substitute</a></u>	Act or serve as a substitute. <i>A father <b>substitute</b>.</i>
<b>substitution</b>	An event in which one thing is substituted for another. <i>He sent Smith in for Jones but the <b>substitution</b> came too late to help.</i>
<b>successor</b>	A person or thing that succeeds another. <i>He was President Lincoln's <b>successor</b>.</i>
<b>supersede</b>	Take the place or move into the position of.
<b>supersede</b>	Take the place or move into the position of. <i>The older models of car have now been <b>superseded</b>.</i>
<b>supplant</b>	Take the place or move into the position of. <i>Domestic production has been <b>supplanted</b> by imports and jobs have been lost.</i>
<b>surety</b>	One who provides a warrant or guarantee to another. <i>The <b>surety</b> of my impending fatherhood.</i>
<b>surrogate</b>	Denoting a child to whom a woman gives birth as a surrogate mother. <i><b>Surrogate</b> father.</i>
<b>transpose</b>	Change key. <i>A sequence of French tales <b>transposed</b> into English.</i>
<b>transposition</b>	The transfer of a quantity from one side of an equation to the other along with a change of sign. <i><b>Transposition</b> of word order.</i>
