bloat	Become bloated or swollen or puff up. <i>The fungus has bloated their abdomens.</i>
broaden	Expand to encompass more people or things. <i>Her interests broadened as she grew up.</i>
decoration	Something used to beautify. <i>A decoration won on the field of battle.</i>
dilate	Make or become wider, larger, or more open. <i>Dilated pupils.</i>
distend	Become wider. <i>The abdomen distended rapidly.</i>
diversify	Make or become more diverse or varied. <i>Diversify a course of study.</i>
dramatize	Adapt (a novel) or present (a particular incident) as a play or film. <i>His play dramatized the plight of Maureen a pregnant young woman.</i>
elaborately	With elaboration. <i>It was elaborately spelled out.</i>
elongate	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>Elongate fishes.</i>
embellish	Make more attractive by adding ornament, colour, etc. <i>Blue silk embellished with golden embroidery.</i>
enlarge	Develop a larger print of (a photograph). <i>Very often a favourite photograph is enlarged and framed.</i>
escalation	An increase in the intensity or seriousness of something; an intensification. <i>Cost escalations.</i>
expand	Expand the influence of. <i>Their business expanded into other hotels.</i>
expanded	Being or having been enlarged or extended. <i>The expanded fins of the ray.</i>
expansion	A discussion that provides additional information. <i>The expansion of a^2b^2 is $a^2b^2 + 2ab^2 + b^4$.</i>
extend	Continue or extend. <i>Extend the TV antenna.</i>
lengthen	Make or become longer. <i>The mascara will lengthen your lashes.</i>

magnification	A photographic print that has been enlarged. <i>The lines are only visible under high magnification.</i>
<u>magnify</u>	Praise highly; glorify. <i>Praise the Lord and magnify Him.</i>
<u>maximize</u>	Make as large or great as possible. <i>A thriller that maximizes the potential of its locations.</i>
prolongation	Extension of the duration of something. <i>An agreement on further prolongation of the boundary proved difficult.</i>
protract	Prolong. <i>He had certainly taken his time even protracting the process.</i>
stretch	The fact or condition of a muscle being stretched. <i>A four year stretch for tax fraud.</i>
stretched	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. <i>Well stretched muscles are less susceptible to injury.</i>
stretching	Exercise designed to extend the limbs and muscles to their full extent.
swell	A welling up of a feeling. <i>She felt herself swell with pride.</i>
widen	Become broader or wider or more extensive. <i>The road widened.</i>
