### Synonyms of "Aggrieved" as an adjective (20 Words)

<b>angry</b>	As if showing violent anger. <i>Why are you <b>angry</b> with me.</i>
<b>anguished</b>	Experiencing or expressing severe mental or physical pain or suffering. <i>An <b>anguished</b> conscience.</i>
<b>annoyed</b>	Troubled persistently especially with petty annoyances. <i>I got very <b>annoyed</b> watching the film.</i>
<b>chagrined</b>	Feeling or caused to feel ill at ease or self-conscious or ashamed. <i><b>Chagrined</b> at the poor sales of his book.</i>
<b>discontented</b>	Showing or experiencing dissatisfaction or restless longing. <i>Was <b>discontented</b> with his position.</i>
<a href="#">disgruntled</a>	In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i>Judges receive letters from <b>disgruntled</b> members of the public.</i>

<b>distressed</b>	Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief. <i>He dropped out of the race clearly <b>distressed</b> and having difficulty breathing.</i>
<b>disturbed</b>	Emotionally unstable and having difficulty coping with personal relationships. <i><b>Disturbed</b> sleep.</i>
<b>hurt</b>	Damaged; used of inanimate objects or their value. <i>You know I care he said in a <b>hurt</b> voice.</i>
<b>in high dudgeon</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b><u>indignant</u></b>	Feeling or showing anger or annoyance at what is perceived as unfair treatment. <i>An <b>indignant</b> denial.</i>
<b>irritated</b>	Showing or feeling slight anger; annoyed. <i>The <b>irritated</b> look on Alec's face.</i>
<b>nettled</b>	Aroused to impatience or anger. <i>Feeling <b>nettled</b> from the constant teasing.</i>
<b>offended</b>	Resentful or annoyed, typically as a result of a perceived insult. <i>He sounded rather <b>offended</b>.</i>
<b><u>pained</u></b>	Affected with pain, especially mental pain; hurt or troubled. <i>Susan looked <b>pained</b>.</i>
<b><u>resentful</u></b>	Feeling or expressing bitterness or indignation at having been treated unfairly. <i><b>Resentful</b> at the way he was treated.</i>
<b>riled</b>	Aroused to impatience or anger. <i><b>Riled</b> no end by his lies.</i>
<b>unhappy</b>	Experiencing or marked by or causing sadness or sorrow or discontent. <i>The <b>unhappy</b> truth.</i>
<b>upset</b>	Unhappy, disappointed, or worried. <i>She looked pale and <b>upset</b>.</i>
<b><u>vexed</u></b>	(of a problem or issue) difficult and much debated; problematic. <i>The <b>vexed</b> question of how much money the government is going to spend.</i>
