Synonyms of "Aggrieved" as an adjective (20 Words)

angry	As if showing violent anger. <i>Why are you angry with me.</i>
anguished	Experiencing or expressing severe mental or physical pain or suffering. <i>An anguished conscience.</i>
annoyed	Troubled persistently especially with petty annoyances. <i>I got very annoyed watching the film.</i>
chagrined	Feeling or caused to feel ill at ease or self-conscious or ashamed. <i>Chagrined at the poor sales of his book.</i>
discontented	Showing or experiencing dissatisfaction or restless longing. <i>Was discontented with his position.</i>
disgruntled	In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i>Judges receive letters from disgruntled members of the public.</i>

distressed	Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief. <i>He dropped out of the race clearly distressed and having difficulty breathing.</i>
disturbed	Emotionally unstable and having difficulty coping with personal relationships. <i>Disturbed sleep.</i>
hurt	Damaged; used of inanimate objects or their value. <i>You know I care he said in a hurt voice.</i>
in high dudgeon	Directed or bound inward.
<u>indignant</u>	Feeling or showing anger or annoyance at what is perceived as unfair treatment. <i>An indignant denial.</i>
irritated	Showing or feeling slight anger; annoyed. <i>The irritated look on Alec's face.</i>
nettled	Aroused to impatience or anger. <i>Feeling nettled from the constant teasing.</i>
offended	Resentful or annoyed, typically as a result of a perceived insult. <i>He sounded rather offended.</i>
<u>pained</u>	Affected with pain, especially mental pain; hurt or troubled. <i>Susan looked pained.</i>
<u>resentful</u>	Feeling or expressing bitterness or indignation at having been treated unfairly. <i>Resentful at the way he was treated.</i>
riled	Aroused to impatience or anger. <i>Riled no end by his lies.</i>
unhappy	Experiencing or marked by or causing sadness or sorrow or discontent. <i>The unhappy truth.</i>
upset	Unhappy, disappointed, or worried. <i>She looked pale and upset.</i>
<u>vexed</u>	(of a problem or issue) difficult and much debated; problematic. <i>The vexed question of how much money the government is going to spend.</i>
