
## Agile as an Adjective

<u>acrobatic</u>	Performing, involving, or adept at spectacular gymnastic feats. An <b>acrobatic</b> dance.
active	(of an electric circuit) capable of modifying its state or characteristics automatically in response to input or feedback. <i>An active antagonism.</i>
<u>acute</u>	Denoting or designed for patients with an acute form of a disease. <i>Acute</i> pain.
alert	Quick and energetic. An <b>alert</b> mind.
astute	Having or showing an ability to accurately assess situations or people and turn this to one's advantage. An <b>astute</b> tenant always reads the small print in a lease.
clever	Healthy or well. She was an extremely <b>clever</b> and studious young woman.



<u>deft</u>	Demonstrating skill and cleverness. <b>Deft</b> fingers massaged her face.
dexterous	Showing or having skill, especially with the hands. <b>Dexterous</b> of hand and inventive of mind.
<u>graceful</u>	Having or showing grace or elegance. She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b> .
intelligent	Exercising or showing good judgment. Anna is <b>intelligent</b> and hard working.
light on one's feet	Intended primarily as entertainment; not serious or profound.
light-footed	Having a light and springy step.
limber	Readily adaptable. <i>Limber</i> graphite fishing rods.
<u>lithe</u>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease. She lay gazing up at his tall <b>lithe</b> figure.
nimble	Mentally quick. Her mind was so <b>nimble</b> and she was so quick to learn.
penetrating	Tending to penetrate; having the power of entering or piercing. <b>Penetrating</b> insight.
perceptive	Of or relating to perception. A <b>perceptive</b> eye.
<u>piercing</u>	(of a feeling) intense, typically in a distressing way. <i>The <b>piercing</b> cold of winter.</i>
quick	Moving quickly and lightly. We went to the pub for a <b>quick</b> drink.
quick off the mark	Hurried and brief.
quick-witted	Mentally nimble and resourceful.
<u>sharp</u>	Keenly and painfully felt as if caused by a sharp edge or point. Fresh goats milk cheese has a slightly <b>sharp</b> er flavour than fromage frais.
shrewd	(especially of weather) piercingly cold. <i>He was too</i> <b>shrewd</b> <i>to go along with them on a road that could lead</i> only to their overthrow.
sprightly	Full of spirit and vitality. A <b>sprightly</b> dance.
spry	(especially of an old person) active; lively. <i>He continued to look <b>spry</b> and active well into his eighties.</i>

briskness	Liveliness and eagerness.
clever	Sensible; well advised. <i>He taught the dog to perform some very</i> <b>clever</b> tricks.
<u>deft</u>	Neatly skilful and quick in one's movements. A <b>deft</b> waiter.
dexterous	Skillful in physical movements; especially of the hands. <i>Dexterous</i> of hand and inventive of mind.
dextrous	Skillful in physical movements; especially of the hands.



<u>effervescent</u>	(of a liquid) giving off bubbles. <i>His fertile <b>effervescent</b> mind</i> .
extraordinarily	Extremely. It will be an <b>extraordinarily</b> painful step to negotiate.
fast	Firmly fixed or attached. <i>Catholics sometimes <b>fast</b> during Lent.</i>
hasty	Done with very great haste and without due deliberation. Rejected what was regarded as an over <b>hasty</b> plan for reconversion.
hurried	Done in a hurry; rushed. A <b>hurried</b> job.
<u>impetuous</u>	Characterized by undue haste and lack of thought or deliberation. An <b>impetuous</b> display of spending and gambling.
instantaneous	Occurring with no delay. <i>Relief was instantaneous</i> .
intelligent	(of a device or building) able to vary its state or action in response to varying situations and past experience. <i>An intelligent</i> solution.
<u>masterful</u>	Performed or performing very skilfully. A <b>masterful</b> assessment of the difficulties.
nimble	(of the mind) able to think and understand quickly. With a deft motion of her <b>nimble</b> fingers.
prompt	The time limit for the payment of an account stated on a prompt note. <i>A prompt reply.</i>
quick	At a fast rate quickly. <i>Come here <b>quick</b>.</i>
rapidly	Very quickly; at a great rate. The business is expanding <b>rapidly</b> .
<u>resourceful</u>	Having the ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties. <i>An able and <b>resourceful</b> politician.</i>
rushed	(of a person) short of time; hurrying. A <b>rushed</b> job.
scintillating	Brilliantly and excitingly clever or skilful. The team produced a <b>scintillating</b> second half performance.
skill	Ability to produce solutions in some problem domain. <i>Difficult work taking great <b>skill</b>.</i>
skillful	Having or showing knowledge and skill and aptitude. The effect was achieved by <b>skillful</b> retouching.



smart	Quick and brisk. We walked at a <b>smart</b> pace.
speedily	Quickly or promptly. Your claim will be dealt with as <b>speedily</b> as possible.
speedy	Done or occurring quickly. A <b>speedy</b> car.
spry	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>The old dog was so <b>spry</b> it was halfway up the stairs before we could stop</i> <i>it.</i>
<u>swift</u>	Swiftly. Streams that ran <b>swift</b> and clear.
