## **Agility as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Agility" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “agility” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The gracefulness of a person or animal that is quick and nimble.*
- *Ability to think and understand quickly.*
- *Ability to move quickly and easily.*



## Synonyms of "Agility" as a noun (4 Words)

- legerity** Lightness in movement or action; nimbleness, agility; (later also) flexibility of mind; mental agility.
- lightness** The property of being comparatively small in weight.  
*The **lightness** of her silky hair.*
- lightsomeness** The gracefulness of a person or animal that is quick and nimble.
- nimbleness** The quality of being nimble.  
*He is not noted for his **nimbleness**.*



## Usage Examples of "Agility" as a noun

- *Though he was without formal training as dancer or athlete, his physical agility was inexhaustible.*
- *Games teach hand-eye coordination, mental agility, and alertness.*



## Associations of "Agility" (30 Words)

<b>acceleration</b>	The act of accelerating; increasing the speed. <i>The three litre model has spectacular <b>acceleration</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">adaptability</a></b>	The quality of being able to adjust to new conditions. <i><b>Adaptability</b> is an advantage in the harshly competitive global economy.</i>
<b>adroitness</b>	Cleverness or skill. <i>He lacks political <b>adroitness</b>.</i>
<b>airspeed</b>	The speed of an aircraft relative to the air in which it is flying.

<b>celerity</b>	A rate that is rapid.
<b>deftness</b>	Skillful performance or ability without difficulty.
<b>escalation</b>	An increase to counteract a perceived discrepancy. <i>The present <b>escalation</b> of global warming.</i>
<b>fast</b>	Performing or able to perform a particular action quickly. <i>Her foot was stuck <b>fast</b>.</i>
<b>fastness</b>	A strongly fortified defensive structure. <i>A remote Himalayan mountain <b>fastness</b>.</i>
<b><u>haste</u></b>	Excessive speed or urgency of movement or action; hurry. <i>He soon regretted his <b>haste</b>.</i>
<b>hurry</b>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>In my <b>hurry</b> to leave I knocked over a pile of books.</i>
<b><u>lightness</u></b>	Having a light color. <i>The <b>lightness</b> of her silky hair.</i>
<b>overhasty</b>	Done with very great haste and without due deliberation. <i>Rejected what was regarded as an <b>overhasty</b> plan for reconversion.</i>
<b>pace</b>	Walk with slow or fast paces. <i>We <b>paced</b> up and down in exasperation.</i>
<b>prompt</b>	The time limit for the payment of an account stated on a prompt note. <i>The fans were <b>prompt</b> in complying with police requests.</i>
<b>promptitude</b>	The characteristic of doing things without delay. <i>He arranges everything with extraordinary <b>promptitude</b> and foresight.</i>
<b>quick</b>	At a fast rate quickly. <i>The <b>quick</b> and the dead.</i>
<b><u>quickness</u></b>	Skillful performance or ability without difficulty. <i>An athlete with outstanding <b>quickness</b> and agility.</i>
<b>rapidity</b>	The quality of moving or reacting with great speed. <i>Technology spreads with extraordinary <b>rapidity</b>.</i>
<b>rapidly</b>	Very quickly; at a great rate. <i>The problem is <b>rapidly</b> worsening.</i>
<b>reflex</b>	In reflexology a response in a part of the body to stimulation of a corresponding point on the feet hands or head. <i>An act of consciousness is a <b>reflex</b> act with its own object viz the act of knowledge itself.</i>
<b>resilience</b>	An occurrence of rebounding or springing back. <i>Nylon is excellent in wearability abrasion resistance and <b>resilience</b>.</i>

<b>responsiveness</b>	The quality of reacting quickly and positively. <i>The <b>responsiveness</b> of the vehicle.</i>
<b><u>speed</u></b>	Of a motorist travel at a speed that is greater than the legal limit. <i>May God <b>speed</b> you.</i>
<b><u>speedy</u></b>	Moving quickly. <i>A <b>speedy</b> winger.</i>
<b><u>stronghold</u></b>	A strongly fortified defensive structure. <i>A Labour <b>stronghold</b>.</i>
<b>suppleness</b>	Adaptability of mind or character. <i>He increased the leanness and <b>suppleness</b> of the organization.</i>
<b><u>swift</u></b>	A swift flying insectivorous bird with long slender wings and a superficial resemblance to a swallow spending most of its life on the wing. <i>A remarkably <b>swift</b> recovery.</i>
<b>swiftness</b>	A rate (usually rapid) at which something happens. <i>Researchers were impressed with the <b>swiftness</b> of responses.</i>
<b>velocity</b>	The rate at which money changes hands within an economy. <i>The tank shot backwards at an incredible <b>velocity</b>.</i>
