Agility as a Noun

Definitions of "Agility" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “agility” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The gracefulness of a person or animal that is quick and nimble.*
- *Ability to think and understand quickly.*
- *Ability to move quickly and easily.*



Synonyms of "Agility" as a noun (4 Words)

- legerity** Lightness in movement or action; nimbleness, agility; (later also) flexibility of mind; mental agility.
- lightness** The property of being comparatively small in weight.
*The **lightness** of her silky hair.*
- lightsomeness** The gracefulness of a person or animal that is quick and nimble.
- nimbleness** The quality of being nimble.
*He is not noted for his **nimbleness**.*



Usage Examples of "Agility" as a noun

- *Though he was without formal training as dancer or athlete, his physical agility was inexhaustible.*
- *Games teach hand-eye coordination, mental agility, and alertness.*



Associations of "Agility" (30 Words)

acceleration	The act of accelerating; increasing the speed. <i>The three litre model has spectacular acceleration.</i>
<u>adaptability</u>	The quality of being able to adjust to new conditions. <i>Adaptability is an advantage in the harshly competitive global economy.</i>
adroitness	Cleverness or skill. <i>He lacks political adroitness.</i>
airspeed	The speed of an aircraft relative to the air in which it is flying.

celerity	A rate that is rapid.
deftness	Skillful performance or ability without difficulty.
escalation	An increase to counteract a perceived discrepancy. <i>The present escalation of global warming.</i>
fast	Performing or able to perform a particular action quickly. <i>Her foot was stuck fast.</i>
fastness	A strongly fortified defensive structure. <i>A remote Himalayan mountain fastness.</i>
<u>haste</u>	Excessive speed or urgency of movement or action; hurry. <i>He soon regretted his haste.</i>
hurry	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i>In my hurry to leave I knocked over a pile of books.</i>
<u>lightness</u>	Having a light color. <i>The lightness of her silky hair.</i>
overhasty	Done with very great haste and without due deliberation. <i>Rejected what was regarded as an overhasty plan for reconversion.</i>
pace	Walk with slow or fast paces. <i>We paced up and down in exasperation.</i>
prompt	The time limit for the payment of an account stated on a prompt note. <i>The fans were prompt in complying with police requests.</i>
promptitude	The characteristic of doing things without delay. <i>He arranges everything with extraordinary promptitude and foresight.</i>
quick	At a fast rate quickly. <i>The quick and the dead.</i>
<u>quickness</u>	Skillful performance or ability without difficulty. <i>An athlete with outstanding quickness and agility.</i>
rapidity	The quality of moving or reacting with great speed. <i>Technology spreads with extraordinary rapidity.</i>
rapidly	Very quickly; at a great rate. <i>The problem is rapidly worsening.</i>
reflex	In reflexology a response in a part of the body to stimulation of a corresponding point on the feet hands or head. <i>An act of consciousness is a reflex act with its own object viz the act of knowledge itself.</i>
resilience	An occurrence of rebounding or springing back. <i>Nylon is excellent in wearability abrasion resistance and resilience.</i>

responsiveness	The quality of reacting quickly and positively. <i>The responsiveness of the vehicle.</i>
<u>speed</u>	Of a motorist travel at a speed that is greater than the legal limit. <i>May God speed you.</i>
<u>speedy</u>	Moving quickly. <i>A speedy winger.</i>
<u>stronghold</u>	A strongly fortified defensive structure. <i>A Labour stronghold.</i>
suppleness	Adaptability of mind or character. <i>He increased the leanness and suppleness of the organization.</i>
<u>swift</u>	A swift flying insectivorous bird with long slender wings and a superficial resemblance to a swallow spending most of its life on the wing. <i>A remarkably swift recovery.</i>
swiftness	A rate (usually rapid) at which something happens. <i>Researchers were impressed with the swiftness of responses.</i>
velocity	The rate at which money changes hands within an economy. <i>The tank shot backwards at an incredible velocity.</i>
