**senescence** The property characteristic of old age.







<u>aged</u>	Of wines fruit cheeses having reached a desired or final condition aged pronounced as one syllable. <b>Aged</b> ten.
<b>battered</b>	Having suffered repeated violence from a spouse, partner, or parent. <i>The battered woman syndrome.</i>
crone	An ugly evil-looking old woman.
dotage	The period of life in which a person is old and weak. You could live here and look after me in my <b>dotage</b> .



<u>elder</u>	Any of various church officers. My <b>elder</b> daughter.
elderly	(of a person) old or ageing. A couple of <b>elderly</b> cars.
<u>frail</u>	The weight of a frail basket full of raisins or figs between 50 and 75 pounds. <i>His small frail body.</i>
gramps	The father of your father or mother.
grandfather	The father of your father or mother. Smokers who worked here before the ban have been <b>grandfather</b> ed.
grandma	One's grandmother. <i>Grandma</i> Wendy.
grandmother	The mother of your father or mother. My <b>grandmother</b> is ill.
infirmity	Physical or mental weakness. Old age and <b>infirmity</b> come to men and women alike.
lifespan	The length of time for which a person or animal lives or a thing functions. <i>The human lifespan</i> .
<u>longevity</u>	Long existence or service. The greater <b>longevity</b> of women compared with men.
nan	A river of western Thailand flowing southward to join the Ping River to form the Chao Phraya.
<u>obsolete</u>	Cause a product or idea to become obsolete by replacing it with something new. <i>The phrase was obsolete after 1625.</i>
old	Used informally especially for emphasis old adj of a very early stage in development. The introduction of the Welfare State eased the problems of the <b>old</b> .
oldie	An older person. Collections of pop <b>oldie</b> s.
osteoporosis	Abnormal loss of bony tissue resulting in fragile porous bones attributable to a lack of calcium; most common in postmenopausal women.
<u>premature</u>	Too soon or too hasty. Illness led to his <b>premature</b> death.
senate	The smaller upper assembly in the US, US states, France, and other countries. The <b>senate</b> must ratify any treaty with a two thirds majority.



senator	A member of a senate. <b>Senator</b> Vandenburg.
senescence	The organic process of growing older and showing the effects of increasing age.
senescent	Growing old.
<u>senile</u>	Mentally or physically infirm with age. She couldn t cope with her <b>senile</b> husband.
senility	Mental infirmity as a consequence of old age; sometimes shown by foolish infatuations. <i>The onset of senility</i> .
<u>senior</u>	A student in one of the higher forms of a senior school. <i>The price is 7 for adults and 3 50 for <b>senior</b>s.</i>
seniority	Higher rank than that of others especially by reason of longer service. <i>Pay and benefits rise with seniority</i> .
spinster	An unmarried woman, typically an older woman beyond the usual age for marriage.
yore	Time long past.
