- Expressing pain or agony.





<u>adversity</u>	A state of misfortune or affliction. <i>Resilience in the face of adversity.</i>
ail	Aromatic bulb used as seasoning. Exercise is good for whatever ail s one.
<u>anguish</u>	Cause emotional anguish or make miserable. Philip gave a cry of anguish .
<u>deadlock</u>	Secure a door with a deadlock. The meeting is deadlock ed.
difficulty	The state or condition of being difficult. They agreed about the difficulty of the climb.
<u>dilemma</u>	A situation in which a difficult choice has to be made between two or more alternatives, especially ones that are equally undesirable. <i>The insoluble dilemma of adolescence.</i>
<u>discomfort</u>	A state of unease, worry, or embarrassment. <i>He appeared to be discomforted by the questioning.</i>
distress	Bring into difficulties or distress especially financial hardship. <i>A ship in distress.</i>
earache	Pain inside the ear. A child complaining of an earache .
<u>halt</u>	Come to a halt stop moving. There is growing pressure to halt the bloodshed.
hardship	Severe suffering or privation. The many hardship s of frontier life.
headache	Pain in the head caused by dilation of cerebral arteries or muscle contractions or a reaction to drugs. An administrative headache .
<u>impasse</u>	A situation in which no progress is possible, especially because of disagreement; a deadlock. <i>Reached an</i> impasse on the negotiations.
<u>needy</u>	Needy people collectively. Those from needy backgrounds.
oppression	The state of being subject to oppressive treatment. A region shattered by oppression and killing.
pain	Cause mental or physical pain to. Her legs had been pain ing her.



<u>plight</u>	A dangerous, difficult, or otherwise unfortunate situation. <i>The woeful plight of homeless people.</i>
predicament	(in Aristotelian logic) each of the ten 'categories', often listed as: substance or being, quantity, quality, relation, place, time, posture, having or possession, action, and passion. <i>Finds himself in a most awkward predicament.</i>
problem	An inquiry starting from given conditions to investigate or demonstrate a fact, result, or law. <i>What s the problem</i> .
problematic	Open to doubt or debate. The problematic s of artificial intelligence.
<u>puzzled</u>	Filled with bewilderment. Puzzled that she left without saying goodbye.
<u>quandary</u>	A situation from which extrication is difficult especially an unpleasant or trying one. <i>Kate was in a quandary.</i>
<u>stalemate</u>	Bring to or cause to reach stalemate. The war had again reached stalemate .
standstill	A situation or condition in which there is no movement or activity at all. <i>The traffic came to a standstill.</i>
suffering	Psychological suffering. <i>Suffering</i> refugees.
<u>throb</u>	Tremble convulsively, as from fear or excitement. The crowded streets throb bed with life.
toothache	Pain in a tooth or teeth. I ve got toothache .
trouble	Take the trouble to do something concern oneself. She was too concerned with her own feelings to trouble about Clare s.
unaccustomed	Not familiar or usual; out of the ordinary. They finished their supper with unaccustomed speed.
unpleasantness	The feeling caused by disagreeable stimuli; one pole of a continuum of states of feeling. She hated unpleasantness though she wouldn t back down from a fight.
