<a href="#"><u>deadlock</u></a>	Secure a door with a deadlock. <i>The meeting is <b>deadlocked</b>.</i>
<b>difficulty</b>	The state or condition of being difficult. <i>They agreed about the <b>difficulty</b> of the climb.</i>
<a href="#"><u>dilemma</u></a>	A situation in which a difficult choice has to be made between two or more alternatives, especially ones that are equally undesirable. <i>The insoluble <b>dilemma</b> of adolescence.</i>
<a href="#"><u>discomfort</u></a>	A state of unease, worry, or embarrassment. <i>He appeared to be <b>discomforted</b> by the questioning.</i>
<b>distress</b>	Bring into difficulties or distress especially financial hardship. <i>A ship in <b>distress</b>.</i>
<b>earache</b>	Pain inside the ear. <i>A child complaining of an <b>earache</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>halt</u></a>	Come to a halt stop moving. <i>There is growing pressure to <b>halt</b> the bloodshed.</i>
<b>hardship</b>	Severe suffering or privation. <i>The many <b>hardships</b> of frontier life.</i>
<b>headache</b>	Pain in the head caused by dilation of cerebral arteries or muscle contractions or a reaction to drugs. <i>An administrative <b>headache</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>impasse</u></a>	A situation in which no progress is possible, especially because of disagreement; a deadlock. <i>Reached an <b>impasse</b> on the negotiations.</i>
<a href="#"><u>needy</u></a>	Needy people collectively. <i>Those from <b>needy</b> backgrounds.</i>
<a href="#"><u>oppression</u></a>	The state of being subject to oppressive treatment. <i>A region shattered by <b>oppression</b> and killing.</i>
<b>pain</b>	Cause mental or physical pain to. <i>Her legs had been <b>paining</b> her.</i>

<b><u>plight</u></b>	A dangerous, difficult, or otherwise unfortunate situation. <i>The woeful <b>plight</b> of homeless people.</i>
<b>predicament</b>	(in Aristotelian logic) each of the ten 'categories', often listed as: substance or being, quantity, quality, relation, place, time, posture, having or possession, action, and passion. <i>Finds himself in a most awkward <b>predicament</b>.</i>
<b>problem</b>	An inquiry starting from given conditions to investigate or demonstrate a fact, result, or law. <i>What s the <b>problem</b>.</i>
<b>problematic</b>	Open to doubt or debate. <i>The <b>problematics</b> of artificial intelligence.</i>
<b><u>puzzled</u></b>	Filled with bewilderment. <i><b>Puzzled</b> that she left without saying goodbye.</i>
<b><u>quandary</u></b>	A situation from which extrication is difficult especially an unpleasant or trying one. <i>Kate was in a <b>quandary</b>.</i>
<b><u>stalemate</u></b>	Bring to or cause to reach stalemate. <i>The war had again reached <b>stalemate</b>.</i>
<b>standstill</b>	A situation or condition in which there is no movement or activity at all. <i>The traffic came to a <b>standstill</b>.</i>
<b>suffering</b>	Psychological suffering. <i><b>Suffering</b> refugees.</i>
<b><u>throb</u></b>	Tremble convulsively, as from fear or excitement. <i>The crowded streets <b>throbbed</b> with life.</i>
<b>toothache</b>	Pain in a tooth or teeth. <i>I ve got <b>toothache</b>.</i>
<b>trouble</b>	Take the trouble to do something concern oneself. <i>She was too concerned with her own feelings to <b>trouble</b> about Clare s.</i>
<b>unaccustomed</b>	Not familiar or usual; out of the ordinary. <i>They finished their supper with <b>unaccustomed</b> speed.</i>
<b>unpleasantness</b>	The feeling caused by disagreeable stimuli; one pole of a continuum of states of feeling. <i>She hated <b>unpleasantness</b> though she wouldn t back down from a fight.</i>
