<u>acute</u>	Denoting or designed for patients with an acute form of a disease. <i>An acute sense of smell</i> .
agonising	Extremely painful.
<u>excruciating</u>	Very embarrassing, awkward, or tedious. <i>He explained the procedure in <b>excruciating</b> detail.</i>
extreme	Most distant in any direction. The <b>extreme</b> north west of Scotland.
grievous	Causing fear or anxiety by threatening great harm. <i>Grievous</i> bodily harm.
harrowing	Acutely distressing. A <b>harrowing</b> film about racism and violence.
<u>hellish</u>	Of or like hell. <b>Hellish</b> weather.
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Intense</i> anxiety.
killing	Causing death. A <b>killing</b> schedule.
<u>painful</u>	Causing physical discomfort. Her ankle was very <b>painful</b> .
<b>piercing</b>	(of a sound) extremely high or loud. A tall blonde with <b>piercing</b> eyes.
racking	Causing great physical or mental suffering.
searing	Extremely hot or intense. A <b>searing</b> pain.
<u>severe</u>	Severely simple. A <b>severe</b> shortage of technicians.
tormenting	Inflicting severe physical or mental suffering. <i>Peace from his tormenting thoughts.</i>
torturesome	Extremely painful.
torturing	Extremely painful.
<u>torturous</u>	Characterized by, involving, or causing pain or suffering. A <b>torturous</b> five days of fitness training.








#### Usage Examples of "Agonizing" as an adjective

# Associations of "Agonizing" (30 Words)

aching	Arousing, experiencing, or expressive of intense sorrow or longing. I write this letter with tears in my eyes and an <b>aching</b> heart.
biting	(of wind or cold) so cold as to be painful. A <b>biting</b> aphorism.
<u>bitter</u>	Beer that is strongly flavoured with hops and has a bitter taste brewed by top fermentation. <i>A bitter</i> struggle.
callus	Cause a callus to form on. The long march had <b>callus</b> ed his feet.
cultivator	A farm implement used to break up the surface of the soil (for aeration and weed control and conservation of moisture. <i>Rotary cultivators are ideal in the kitchen garden.</i>
<u>disastrous</u>	Highly unsuccessful. A <b>disastrous</b> fire swept through the museum.
distressing	Causing anxiety, sorrow or pain; upsetting. <i>Distressing</i> or disturbing news.
doleful	Causing grief or misfortune. A <b>doleful</b> look.
dolorous	Feeling or expressing great sorrow or distress. A <b>dolorous</b> and repetitive tale of atrocity.
<u>excruciating</u>	Extremely painful. <i>Excruciating</i> back pain.
<u>frustrating</u>	Discouraging by hindering. It can be very <b>frustrating</b> to find that the size you want isn t there.
grievous	Causing fear or anxiety by threatening great harm. A <b>grievous</b> loss.
harrowing	Extremely painful. It was a <b>harrowing</b> experience.
horrible	Very unpleasant. War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b> .
irksome	So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness. An <b>irksome</b> journey.
lamentable	(of circumstances or conditions) very bad; deplorable. A <i>lamentable</i> decision.



mournful	Feeling, expressing, or inducing sadness, regret, or grief. <i>Mournful music</i> .
<u>painful</u>	Causing distress or trouble. A <b>painful</b> experience.
<u>plaintive</u>	Sounding sad and mournful. A <b>plaintive</b> cry.
<u>poignant</u>	Keenly distressing to the mind or feelings. A <b>poignant</b> reminder of the passing of time.
sad	Of things that make you feel sad Christina Rossetti. Feeling <b>sad</b> because his dog had died.
sore	(of a part of one's body) painful or aching. We re in <b>sore</b> need of him.
<u>sorrowful</u>	Feeling or showing grief. She looked at him with <b>sorrowful</b> eyes.
<u>stressful</u>	Extremely irritating to the nerves. Corporate finance work can be <b>stressful</b> .
<u>swollen</u>	Characteristic of false pride; having an exaggerated sense of self- importance. So <b>swollen</b> by victory that he was unfit for normal duty.
tine	Prong on a fork or pitchfork or antler.
<u>torturous</u>	Extremely painful. A <b>torturous</b> five days of fitness training.
<u>tragic</u>	Very sad; especially involving grief or death or destruction. <i>The shooting was a <b>tragic</b> accident.</i>
<u>traumatic</u>	Psychologically painful. She was going through a <b>traumatic</b> divorce.
trying	Extremely irritating to the nerves. <i>Fell upon <b>trying</b> times.</i>
