## Agrees as a Verb

### Definitions of "Agrees" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “agrees” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Achieve harmony of opinion, feeling, or purpose.*
- *Be in accord; be in agreement.*
- *Be agreeable or suitable.*
- *Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.*
- *Consent or assent to a condition, or agree to do something.*
- *Go together.*
- *Show grammatical agreement.*

- accord** Give or grant someone (power, status, or recognition).  
*His views **accorded** well with those of Merivale.*
- check** Put a check mark on or near or next to.  
*Users who want privacy should **check** the box that prevents your files from being shared.*
- concord** Arrange by concord or agreement.  
*Their ideas **concorded**.*
- concur** Agree with (a decision or opinion).  
*In tests cytogenetic determination has been found to **concur** with enzymatic determination.*
- consort** Keep company.  
*You chose to **consort** with the enemy.*
- correspond** Exchange messages.  
*The rank of Feldwebel in the German forces nominally **corresponded** to the British rank of sergeant.*
- fit** Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired.  
*The shoes **fitted** better after being stretched.*

- fit in** Be the right size or shape; fit correctly or as desired.
- gibe** Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.  
*Some cynics in the media might **gibe**.*
- harmonise** Write a harmony for.
- harmonize** Bring into consonance, harmony, or accord while making music or singing.  
*We **harmonize** a scale using only the notes from that particular key.*
- hold** Lessen the intensity of temper hold in restraint hold or keep within limits.  
*The police were **holding** him on a murder charge.*
- jibe** Shift from one side of the ship to the other.  
*Some cynics in the media might **jibe**.*
- match** Make equal uniform corresponding or matching.  
*Her persistence and ambition only **matches** that of her parents.*
- tally** Agree or correspond.  
*Their signatures should **tally** with their names on the register.*



## Usage Examples of "Agrees" as a verb

- *No two of my colleagues would agree on whom to elect chairman.*
- *She agreed to all my conditions.*
- *We agreed on the terms of the settlement.*
- *I can't agree with you!*
- *White wine doesn't agree with me.*
- *He agreed to leave her alone.*
- *Subjects and verbs must always agree in English.*
- *The two stories don't agree in many details.*

<b>allow</b>	Allow the other baseball team to score. <i>He stopped to <b>allow</b> his eyes to adjust.</i>
<b>approbation</b>	Official recognition or approval. <i>A term of <b>approbation</b>.</i>
<b>approval</b>	The belief that someone or something is good or acceptable. <i>The road schemes have been given <b>approval</b>.</i>
<b>approve</b>	Give sanction to. <i>I don t <b>approve</b> of romance.</i>
<b>assent</b>	Official agreement or sanction. <i>The Maestro <b>assented</b> to the request for an encore.</i>
<b>coincide</b>	Be present at the same place and at the same time. <i>The two long distance walks briefly <b>coincide</b> here.</i>
<b>concession</b>	A point conceded or yielded. <i>Railcard holders can obtain <b>concessions</b>.</i>
<b>concur</b>	Be in accord; be in agreement. <i>We strongly <b>concur</b> with this recommendation.</i>
<b>concurrence</b>	Agreement or consistency. <i>Delays can be avoided by arriving at political <b>concurrence</b> at the start.</i>
<b>conform</b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The countryside should <b>conform</b> to a certain idea of the picturesque.</i>
<b>consensus</b>	A general agreement. <i>The lack of <b>consensus</b> reflected differences in theoretical positions.</i>
<b>consent</b>	Permission to do something. <i>He indicated his <b>consent</b>.</i>
<b>correspond</b>	Take the place of or be parallel or equivalent to. <i>My Russian pen pal and I have been <b>corresponding</b> for several years.</i>
<b>grant</b>	A contract granting the right to operate a subsidiary business. <i>They will <b>grant</b> you asylum.</i>
<b>necessarily</b>	As a necessary result; inevitably. <i>It is <b>necessarily</b> so.</i>
<b>ok</b>	A state in south central United States. <i>Things are <b>okay</b>.</i>

<b>permissible</b>	That may be permitted especially as according to rule. A <b>permissible</b> tax deduction.
<b>permission</b>	The action of officially allowing someone to do a particular thing; consent or authorization. He received <b>permission</b> to go to Brussels.
<b>ratification</b>	The action of signing or giving formal consent to a treaty, contract, or agreement, making it officially valid. <b>Ratification</b> of the treaty raised problems in several member states.
<b>ratify</b>	Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation. Both countries were due to <b>ratify</b> the treaty by the end of the year.
<b>sanction</b>	Give religious sanction to such as through on oath. The scheme was <b>sanctioned</b> by the court.
<b>treaty</b>	A formally concluded and ratified agreement between states. The two Presidents signed a ten year <b>treaty</b> of solidarity.
<b>unanimity</b>	Everyone being of one mind. There is almost complete <b>unanimity</b> on this issue.
<b>unanimously</b>	Of one mind; without dissent. A committee of MPs has <b>unanimously</b> agreed to back his bill.
<b>yes</b>	An affirmative. I was hoping for a <b>yes</b> .
