Agrees as a Verb

Definitions of "Agrees" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “agrees” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Achieve harmony of opinion, feeling, or purpose.*
- *Be in accord; be in agreement.*
- *Be agreeable or suitable.*
- *Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.*
- *Consent or assent to a condition, or agree to do something.*
- *Go together.*
- *Show grammatical agreement.*

- accord** Give or grant someone (power, status, or recognition).
*His views **accorded** well with those of Merivale.*
- check** Put a check mark on or near or next to.
*Users who want privacy should **check** the box that prevents your files from being shared.*
- concord** Arrange by concord or agreement.
*Their ideas **concorded**.*
- concur** Agree with (a decision or opinion).
*In tests cytogenetic determination has been found to **concur** with enzymatic determination.*
- consort** Keep company.
*You chose to **consort** with the enemy.*
- correspond** Exchange messages.
*The rank of Feldwebel in the German forces nominally **corresponded** to the British rank of sergeant.*
- fit** Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired.
*The shoes **fitted** better after being stretched.*

- fit in** Be the right size or shape; fit correctly or as desired.
- gibe** Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.
*Some cynics in the media might **gibe**.*
- harmonise** Write a harmony for.
- harmonize** Bring into consonance, harmony, or accord while making music or singing.
*We **harmonize** a scale using only the notes from that particular key.*
- hold** Lessen the intensity of temper hold in restraint hold or keep within limits.
*The police were **holding** him on a murder charge.*
- jibe** Shift from one side of the ship to the other.
*Some cynics in the media might **jibe**.*
- match** Make equal uniform corresponding or matching.
*Her persistence and ambition only **matches** that of her parents.*
- tally** Agree or correspond.
*Their signatures should **tally** with their names on the register.*



Usage Examples of "Agrees" as a verb

- *No two of my colleagues would agree on whom to elect chairman.*
- *She agreed to all my conditions.*
- *We agreed on the terms of the settlement.*
- *I can't agree with you!*
- *White wine doesn't agree with me.*
- *He agreed to leave her alone.*
- *Subjects and verbs must always agree in English.*
- *The two stories don't agree in many details.*

approbation	Official recognition or approval. <i>A term of approbation.</i>
approval	The belief that someone or something is good or acceptable. <i>The road schemes have been given approval.</i>
approve	Give sanction to. <i>I don't approve of romance.</i>
assent	Official agreement or sanction. <i>The Maestro assented to the request for an encore.</i>
coincide	Be present at the same place and at the same time. <i>The two long distance walks briefly coincide here.</i>
concession	A point conceded or yielded. <i>Railcard holders can obtain concessions.</i>
concur	Be in accord; be in agreement. <i>We strongly concur with this recommendation.</i>
concurrence	Agreement or consistency. <i>Delays can be avoided by arriving at political concurrence at the start.</i>
conform	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The countryside should conform to a certain idea of the picturesque.</i>
consensus	A general agreement. <i>The lack of consensus reflected differences in theoretical positions.</i>
consent	Permission to do something. <i>He indicated his consent.</i>
correspond	Take the place of or be parallel or equivalent to. <i>My Russian pen pal and I have been corresponding for several years.</i>
grant	A contract granting the right to operate a subsidiary business. <i>They will grant you asylum.</i>
necessarily	As a necessary result; inevitably. <i>It is necessarily so.</i>
ok	A state in south central United States. <i>Things are okay.</i>

permissible	That may be permitted especially as according to rule. A permissible tax deduction.
permission	The action of officially allowing someone to do a particular thing; consent or authorization. He received permission to go to Brussels.
ratification	The action of signing or giving formal consent to a treaty, contract, or agreement, making it officially valid. Ratification of the treaty raised problems in several member states.
ratify	Approve and express assent, responsibility, or obligation. Both countries were due to ratify the treaty by the end of the year.
sanction	Give religious sanction to such as through on oath. The scheme was sanctioned by the court.
treaty	A formally concluded and ratified agreement between states. The two Presidents signed a ten year treaty of solidarity.
unanimity	Everyone being of one mind. There is almost complete unanimity on this issue.
unanimously	Of one mind; without dissent. A committee of MPs has unanimously agreed to back his bill.
yes	An affirmative. I was hoping for a yes .
