• An often persistent bodily disorder or disease; a cause for complaining.







disorders; may be caused by m.

A fatal epidemic disease, especially bubonic plague. pestilence

An acute viral disease marked by inflammation of nerve cells of the brain polio

stem and spinal cord.

An infectious viral disease that affects the central nervous system and can poliomyelitis

cause temporary or permanent paralysis.
