Definitions of "Airborne" as an adjective

- *Moved or conveyed by or through air.*
- *(of an aircraft) in the air after taking off.*
- *Transported by air.*

Used in names of animals that can glide by using winglike membranes or other structures e g flying squirrel.

*One passenger was cut by **flying** glass.*

in flight Currently fashionable.

in the air Currently fashionable.



Usage Examples of "Airborne" as an adjective

- *The shuttle was airborne.*
- *Airborne pollutants.*



Associations of "Airborne" (30 Words)

aeronaut	A traveller in a hot-air balloon, airship, or other flying craft.
<u>aircraft</u>	A vehicle that can fly.
airman	Someone who operates an aircraft.
<u>airplane</u>	An aircraft that has a fixed wing and is powered by propellers or jets. <i>The flight was delayed due to trouble with the airplane.</i>
airport	Relating to or denoting light popular fiction such as is offered for sale to travellers in airports. <i>An airport thriller.</i>
butterfly	Flutter like a butterfly. <i>A butterfly clip.</i>

cabin	Confine to a small space such as a cabin. <i>She lay in her cabin on a steamer.</i>
fledged	(of a young bird) having wing feathers that are large enough for flight; able to fly. <i>A newly fledged Detective Inspector.</i>
<u>flight</u>	A formation of aircraft in flight. <i>The history of space flight.</i>
<u>fly</u>	Release a bird to fly especially a hawk for hunting or a pigeon for racing. <i>Rumors and accusations are flying.</i>
<u>flying</u>	Used in names of animals that can glide by using winglike membranes or other structures e g flying squirrel. <i>Flying was still an exciting adventure for him.</i>
footloose	Able to travel freely and do as one pleases due to a lack of responsibilities or commitments. <i>Americans have always been a footloose people always moving on.</i>
hangar	House an aircraft in a hangar. <i>The army choppers that were hangared out at Springs.</i>
helicopter	Transport by helicopter. <i>He was helicoptered out with a bleeding ulcer.</i>
<u>hover</u>	Be suspended in the air, as if in defiance of gravity. <i>Army helicopters hovered overhead.</i>
immigrate	Migrate to a new environment. <i>Many people immigrated at the beginning of the 20th century.</i>
levitate	Cause to rise in the air and float, as if in defiance of gravity. <i>I swear to God he levitated over the bar.</i>
maneuverable	Capable of maneuvering or changing position. <i>A highly maneuverable ship.</i>
mobile	Relating to mobile phones handheld computers and similar technology. <i>A cup of tea from the mobile canteen.</i>
moth	A clothes moth. <i>I store my sweaters in plastic bags to protect them from moths.</i>
parachute	Drop from an aircraft by parachute. <i>The saviour of many pilots has been the parachute.</i>
paratrooper	A soldier in the paratroops.
<u>pilot</u>	Be the pilot of an aircraft or ship. <i>Many expected him to get the job as Desert Orchid s pilot.</i>

plane	Cut or remove with or as if with a plane. <i>Plane the top of the door.</i>
pterodactyl	A pterosaur of the late Jurassic period, with a long slender head and neck and a very short tail.
sortie	Come out from a defensive position to make an attack. <i>We ll soon know if they sortie.</i>
terminal	Suffering from or relating to a terminal disease. <i>Battery terminals.</i>
volant	With wings extended in a flying position. <i>Newly volant young.</i>
wing	The wing of a bird as food. <i>The convent was at some distance but fear would wing her steps.</i>
winged	Having wings or as if having wings of a specified kind. <i>On winged feet.</i>
