- Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air.
- Open to or abounding in fresh air.
- Not treating something as serious; casual.
- Not practical or realizable; speculative.
- Giving an impression of light gracefulness and elegance.
- (of a room or building) spacious, well lit, and well ventilated.
- Delicate, as though filled with or made of air.
- Having little or no perceptible weight; so light as to resemble air.
- Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air-Thomas Carlyle.

aerial	Coming or carried out from the air, especially using aircraft. <i>Aerial photography.</i>
aeriform	Insubstantial, intangible, unreal. Figures light and <b>aeriform</b> come unlooked for and melt away.
aery	Of or belonging to the air; aerial; (hence) ethereal, spiritual, incorporeal, insubstantial.
aired	Open to or abounding in fresh air.
breezy	Appearing relaxed, informal, and cheerily brisk. The text is written in a <b>breezy</b> matter of fact manner.
<u>casual</u>	Happening by chance; accidental. <i>Casual</i> jobs.
delicate	Very fine in texture or structure; of intricate workmanship or quality. <i>His <b>delicate</b> health.</i>



<u>ethereal</u>	(of a solution) having diethyl ether as a solvent. <b>Ethereal</b> otherworldly visions.
feathery	Having, covered with, or resembling feathers. The <b>feathery</b> congregation of jays.
fine	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. There is a <b>fine</b> distinction between misrepresenting the truth and lying.
flimsy	(of clothing) very light and thin. The <b>flimsy</b> garment fell from her.
flippant	Showing inappropriate levity. A <b>flippant</b> remark.
floaty	(especially of a woman's garment or a fabric) light and flimsy. <i>Elegant <b>floaty</b> dresses.</i>
fresh	(of food) recently made or obtained; not tinned, frozen, or otherwise preserved. <i>We were <b>fresh</b> out of art school.</i>
<u>impractical</u>	(of a person) not skilled or interested in doing practical work. <i>Impractical</i> high heels.
insouciant	Marked by blithe unconcern. An utterly <b>insouciant</b> financial policy.
insubstantial	Lacking in nutritive value. Vinyl siding has become the standard bearer for cheap <b>insubstantial</b> construction.
laputan	Relating to or characteristic of the imaginary country of Laputa or its people.
<u>nonchalant</u>	Marked by blithe unconcern. Drove his car with <b>nonchalant</b> abandon.
soft	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. <b>Soft</b> voices.
<u>visionary</u>	Thinking about or planning the future with imagination or wisdom. <i>Visionary dreams.</i>
well ventilated	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
windy	Abounding in or exposed to the wind or breezes. A <b>windy</b> dash home.
wispy	Lacking clarity or distinctness. A few <b>wispy</b> memories of childhood.

billowing	Characterized by great swelling waves or surges. A <b>billowing</b> skirt and shirt.
<u>breadth</u>	Wide range or extent. A teacher must have a <b>breadth</b> of knowledge of the subject.
broad	Showing or characterized by broad mindedness. A <b>broad</b> hint.
capacious	Having a lot of space inside; roomy. <i>She carried a <b>capacious</b> bag.</i>



commodious	Roomy and comfortable. A <b>commodious</b> building suitable for conventions.
distributed	Shared or spread out. The figures of syllogisms all have properly <b>distributed</b> middle terms.
eddy	A circular movement of wind, fog, or smoke. An <b>eddy</b> of chill air swirled into the carriage.
expanded	Increased in extent or size or bulk or scope. The <b>expanded</b> fins of the ray.
<u>expanse</u>	The distance to which something expands or can be expanded. The moth has a wing <b>expanse</b> of 20 to 24 mm.
extensive	Broad in scope or content. They suffered <b>extensive</b> damage.
<u>extensively</u>	In a widespread way. He has written <b>extensively</b> about the project.
fireplace	A structure surrounding a fireplace. A big open <b>fireplace</b> with a brick surround.
gamut	The lowest note in the gamut scale. The whole <b>gamut</b> of human emotion.
<u>lounge</u>	A sitting room in a house. <i>A TV <b>lounge</b></i> .
outspread	Spread out. <i>Outspread</i> hands.
panoramic	As from an altitude or distance. A <b>panoramic</b> view.
roomy	Having ample space. A <b>roomy</b> but sparsely furnished apartment.
<u>spacious</u>	(of buildings and rooms) having ample space. The hotel has a <b>spacious</b> lounge and TV room.
suffuse	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. The first half of the poem is <b>suffuse</b> d with idealism.
<u>swath</u>	The space created by the swing of a scythe or the cut of a mowing machine.
<u>sweeping</u>	Dirt or refuse collected by sweeping. A wide <b>sweeping</b> view of the river.
vast	Of very great extent or quantity; immense. At <b>vast</b> or immense expense.
vent	A slit in a garment (as in the back seam of a jacket. <i>Remove any debris blocking the <b>vent</b>s.</i>



ventilate	Kill (someone) by shooting. He used the club to <b>ventilate</b> an ongoing complaint.
wholesale	At a wholesale price. Imported clothing which he now <b>wholesale</b> s to 20 retail stores.
<u>wide</u>	A ball that is judged to be too wide of the stumps for the batsman to play for which an extra is awarded to the batting side. <i>The current taste for wide trousers.</i>
<u>windy</u>	Using or containing too many words. A <b>windy</b> dash home.
wingspan	Linear distance between the extremities of an airfoil. An eagle with a <b>wingspan</b> of 7 ft.
