- *Not treating something as serious; casual.*
- *Not practical or realizable; speculative.*
- *Giving an impression of light gracefulness and elegance.*
- *(of a room or building) spacious, well lit, and well ventilated.*
- *Delicate, as though filled with or made of air.*
- *Having little or no perceptible weight; so light as to resemble air.*
- *Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air-

aerial	Coming or carried out from the air, especially using aircraft. <i>Aerial photography.</i>
aeriform	Insubstantial, intangible, unreal. <i>Figures light and aeriform come unlooked for and melt away.</i>
aery	Of or belonging to the air; aerial; (hence) ethereal, spiritual, incorporeal, insubstantial.
aired	Open to or abounding in fresh air.
breezy	Appearing relaxed, informal, and cheerily brisk. <i>The text is written in a breezy matter of fact manner.</i>
casual	Happening by chance; accidental. <i>Casual jobs.</i>
delicate	Very fine in texture or structure; of intricate workmanship or quality. <i>His delicate health.</i>

<u>ethereal</u>	(of a solution) having diethyl ether as a solvent. Ethereal <i>otherworldly visions.</i>
feathery	Having, covered with, or resembling feathers. <i>The feathery congregation of jays.</i>
fine	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. <i>There is a fine distinction between misrepresenting the truth and lying.</i>
flimsy	(of clothing) very light and thin. <i>The flimsy garment fell from her.</i>
flippant	Showing inappropriate levity. <i>A flippant remark.</i>
floaty	(especially of a woman's garment or a fabric) light and flimsy. <i>Elegant floaty dresses.</i>
fresh	(of food) recently made or obtained; not tinned, frozen, or otherwise preserved. <i>We were fresh out of art school.</i>
<u>impractical</u>	(of a person) not skilled or interested in doing practical work. Impractical <i>high heels.</i>
insouciant	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>An utterly insouciant financial policy.</i>
insubstantial	Lacking in nutritive value. <i>Vinyl siding has become the standard bearer for cheap insubstantial construction.</i>
laputan	Relating to or characteristic of the imaginary country of Laputa or its people.
<u>nonchalant</u>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>Drove his car with nonchalant abandon.</i>
soft	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. Soft <i>voices.</i>
<u>visionary</u>	Thinking about or planning the future with imagination or wisdom. Visionary <i>dreams.</i>
well ventilated	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
<u>windy</u>	Abounding in or exposed to the wind or breezes. <i>A windy dash home.</i>
wispy	Lacking clarity or distinctness. <i>A few wispy memories of childhood.</i>

commodious	Roomy and comfortable. <i>A commodious building suitable for conventions.</i>
distributed	Shared or spread out. <i>The figures of syllogisms all have properly distributed middle terms.</i>
eddy	A circular movement of wind, fog, or smoke. <i>An eddy of chill air swirled into the carriage.</i>
expanded	Increased in extent or size or bulk or scope. <i>The expanded fins of the ray.</i>
<u>expansive</u>	The distance to which something expands or can be expanded. <i>The moth has a wing expansive of 20 to 24 mm.</i>
extensive	Broad in scope or content. <i>They suffered extensive damage.</i>
<u>extensively</u>	In a widespread way. <i>He has written extensively about the project.</i>
fireplace	A structure surrounding a fireplace. <i>A big open fireplace with a brick surround.</i>
gamut	The lowest note in the gamut scale. <i>The whole gamut of human emotion.</i>
<u>lounge</u>	A sitting room in a house. <i>A TV lounge.</i>
outspread	Spread out. <i>Outspread hands.</i>
panoramic	As from an altitude or distance. <i>A panoramic view.</i>
roomy	Having ample space. <i>A roomy but sparsely furnished apartment.</i>
<u>spacious</u>	(of buildings and rooms) having ample space. <i>The hotel has a spacious lounge and TV room.</i>
suffuse	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>The first half of the poem is suffused with idealism.</i>
<u>swath</u>	The space created by the swing of a scythe or the cut of a mowing machine.
<u>sweeping</u>	Dirt or refuse collected by sweeping. <i>A wide sweeping view of the river.</i>
vast	Of very great extent or quantity; immense. <i>At vast or immense expense.</i>
vent	A slit in a garment (as in the back seam of a jacket). <i>Remove any debris blocking the vents.</i>

- ventilate** Kill (someone) by shooting.
*He used the club to **ventilate** an ongoing complaint.*
- wholesale** At a wholesale price.
*Imported clothing which he now **wholesales** to 20 retail stores.*
- wide** A ball that is judged to be too wide of the stumps for the batsman to play for which an extra is awarded to the batting side.
*The current taste for **wide** trousers.*
- windy** Using or containing too many words.
*A **windy** dash home.*
- wingspan** Linear distance between the extremities of an airfoil.
*An eagle with a **wingspan** of 7 ft.*
