<b>feathery</b>	Having, covered with, or resembling feathers. <i>The <b>feathery</b> congregation of jays.</i>
<b>fine</b>	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. <i>There is a <b>fine</b> distinction between misrepresenting the truth and lying.</i>
<b>flimsy</b>	(of clothing) very light and thin. <i>The <b>flimsy</b> garment fell from her.</i>
<b>flippant</b>	Showing inappropriate levity. <i>A <b>flippant</b> remark.</i>
<b>floaty</b>	(especially of a woman's garment or a fabric) light and flimsy. <i>Elegant <b>floaty</b> dresses.</i>
<b>fresh</b>	(of food) recently made or obtained; not tinned, frozen, or otherwise preserved. <i>We were <b>fresh</b> out of art school.</i>
<b><u>impractical</u></b>	(of a person) not skilled or interested in doing practical work. <b>Impractical</b> <i>high heels.</i>
<b>insouciant</b>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>An utterly <b>insouciant</b> financial policy.</i>
<b>insubstantial</b>	Lacking in nutritive value. <i>Vinyl siding has become the standard bearer for cheap <b>insubstantial</b> construction.</i>
<b>laputan</b>	Relating to or characteristic of the imaginary country of Laputa or its people.
<b><u>nonchalant</u></b>	Marked by blithe unconcern. <i>Drove his car with <b>nonchalant</b> abandon.</i>
<b>soft</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music soft in a quiet subdued tone. <b>Soft</b> <i>voices.</i>
<b><u>visionary</u></b>	Thinking about or planning the future with imagination or wisdom. <b>Visionary</b> <i>dreams.</i>
<b>well ventilated</b>	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
<b><u>windy</u></b>	Abounding in or exposed to the wind or breezes. <i>A <b>windy</b> dash home.</i>
<b>wispy</b>	Lacking clarity or distinctness. <i>A few <b>wispy</b> memories of childhood.</i>

<b>commodious</b>	Roomy and comfortable. <i>A <b>commodious</b> building suitable for conventions.</i>
<b>distributed</b>	Shared or spread out. <i>The figures of syllogisms all have properly <b>distributed</b> middle terms.</i>
<b>eddy</b>	A circular movement of wind, fog, or smoke. <i>An <b>eddy</b> of chill air swirled into the carriage.</i>
<b>expanded</b>	Increased in extent or size or bulk or scope. <i>The <b>expanded</b> fins of the ray.</i>
<b><u>expansive</u></b>	The distance to which something expands or can be expanded. <i>The moth has a wing <b>expansive</b> of 20 to 24 mm.</i>
<b>extensive</b>	Broad in scope or content. <i>They suffered <b>extensive</b> damage.</i>
<b><u>extensively</u></b>	In a widespread way. <i>He has written <b>extensively</b> about the project.</i>
<b>fireplace</b>	A structure surrounding a fireplace. <i>A big open <b>fireplace</b> with a brick surround.</i>
<b>gamut</b>	The lowest note in the gamut scale. <i>The whole <b>gamut</b> of human emotion.</i>
<b><u>lounge</u></b>	A sitting room in a house. <i>A TV <b>lounge</b>.</i>
<b>outspread</b>	Spread out. <i><b>Outspread</b> hands.</i>
<b>panoramic</b>	As from an altitude or distance. <i>A <b>panoramic</b> view.</i>
<b>roomy</b>	Having ample space. <i>A <b>roomy</b> but sparsely furnished apartment.</i>
<b><u>spacious</u></b>	(of buildings and rooms) having ample space. <i>The hotel has a <b>spacious</b> lounge and TV room.</i>
<b>suffuse</b>	Cause to spread or flush or flood through, over, or across. <i>The first half of the poem is <b>suffused</b> with idealism.</i>
<b><u>swath</u></b>	The space created by the swing of a scythe or the cut of a mowing machine.
<b><u>sweeping</u></b>	Dirt or refuse collected by sweeping. <i>A wide <b>sweeping</b> view of the river.</i>
<b>vast</b>	Of very great extent or quantity; immense. <i>At <b>vast</b> or immense expense.</i>
<b>vent</b>	A slit in a garment (as in the back seam of a jacket). <i>Remove any debris blocking the <b>vents</b>.</i>

- ventilate** Kill (someone) by shooting.  
*He used the club to **ventilate** an ongoing complaint.*
- wholesale** At a wholesale price.  
*Imported clothing which he now **wholesales** to 20 retail stores.*
- wide** A ball that is judged to be too wide of the stumps for the batsman to play for which an extra is awarded to the batting side.  
*The current taste for **wide** trousers.*
- windy** Using or containing too many words.  
*A **windy** dash home.*
- wingspan** Linear distance between the extremities of an airfoil.  
*An eagle with a **wingspan** of 7 ft.*
