Aisle as a Noun

Definitions of "Aisle" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “aisle” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A long narrow passage (as in a cave or woods).*
- *Passageway between seating areas as in an auditorium or passenger vehicle or between areas of shelves of goods as in stores.*
- *A passage between rows of seats in a building such as a church or theatre, an aircraft, or train.*
- *A passage between cabinets and shelves of goods in a supermarket or other building.*
- *Part of a church divided laterally from the nave proper by rows of pillars or columns.*
- *(in a church) a lower part parallel to the nave, choir, or transept, from which it is divided by pillars.*



Synonyms of "Aisle" as a noun (8 Words)

alley	A path lined with trees, bushes, or stones. <i>A skittle alley.</i>
corridor	A passage along the side of some railway carriages, from which doors lead into compartments. <i>His room lay at the very end of the corridor.</i>
gangway	A movable bridge linking a ship to the shore.
lane	A dark streak or band which shows up against a bright background, especially in a spiral galaxy. <i>The car moved into the outside lane.</i>
<u>passage</u>	A narrow way allowing access between buildings or to different rooms within a building a passageway. <i>The larger bedroom was at the end of the passage.</i>
passageway	A passage between rooms or between buildings. <i>The palace was full of secret passageways.</i>

path

A schedule available for allocation to an individual railway train over a given route.

*Genius usually follows a revolutionary **path**.*

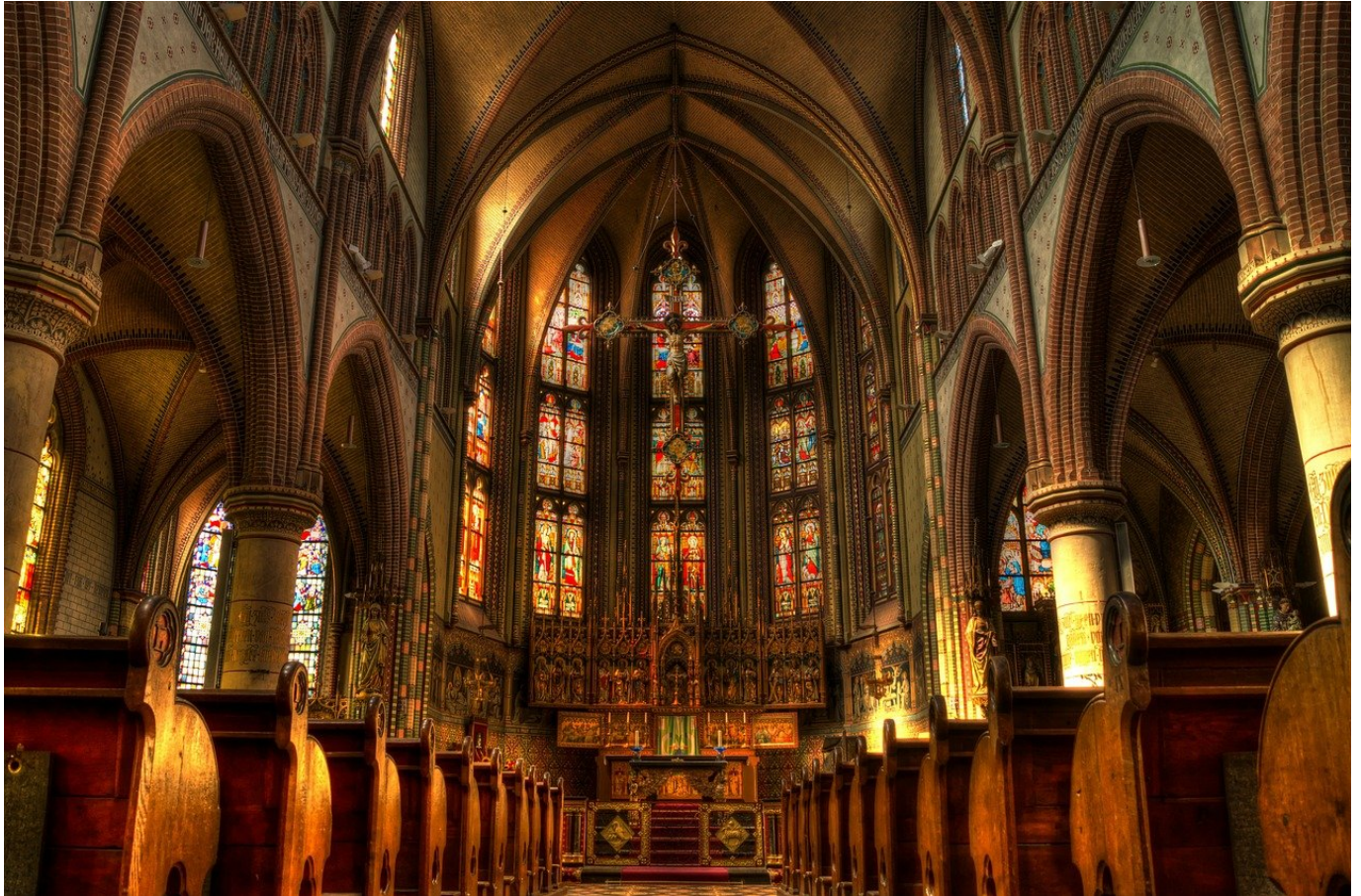
walkway

A passage or path for walking along, especially a raised passageway connecting different sections of a building or a wide path in a park or garden.



Usage Examples of "Aisle" as a noun

- *The musical had the audience dancing in the aisles.*
- *I spend much of my time at the shops, wandering through the aisles.*
- *The tiled roof over the south aisle.*



Associations of "Aisle" (30 Words)

alley	The area between the outfielders in left-centre or right-centre field. <i>A skittle alley.</i>
antechamber	A large entrance or reception room or area. <i>The antechamber to an interview room.</i>
anteroom	A large entrance or reception room or area.
<u>arcade</u>	A covered passage with arches along one or both sides. <i>A shopping arcade.</i>
colonnade	Structure consisting of a row of evenly spaced columns.
concourse	The action of coming together or meeting. <i>A vast concourse of onlookers.</i>
corridor	A passage along the side of some railway carriages, from which doors lead into compartments. <i>The security forces established corridors for humanitarian supplies.</i>

<u>door</u>	A doorway. <i>He knocked on the door.</i>
<u>doorway</u>	The entrance (the space in a wall) through which you enter or leave a room or building; the space that a door can close. <i>He stuck his head in the doorway.</i>
expo	A large international exhibition.
foyer	An entrance hall or other open area in a building used by the public, especially a hotel or theatre. <i>The foyer of the concert hall.</i>
gangway	A temporary passageway of planks (as over mud on a building site).
<u>hall</u>	A large country house, especially one with a landed estate. <i>The elevators were at the end of the hall.</i>
hallway	An interior passage or corridor onto which rooms open.
<u>hotel</u>	An establishment providing accommodation, meals, and other services for travellers and tourists. <i>A five star hotel.</i>
<u>lobby</u>	An interest group that tries to influence legislators or bureaucrats to act in their favor typically through lobbying. <i>They went into the hotel lobby.</i>
<u>lounge</u>	A room (as in a hotel or airport) with seating where people can wait. <i>The departure lounge.</i>
<u>mansion</u>	A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle Mansions.</i>
narrow	A narrow strait connecting two bodies of water. <i>She narrowed her eyes at him suspiciously.</i>
nave	The central part of a church building, intended to accommodate most of the congregation. In traditional Western churches it is rectangular, separated from the chancel by a step or rail, and from adjacent aisles by pillars.
<u>passage</u>	Subject a strain of microorganisms or cells to a passage. <i>A passage migrant.</i>
passageway	A long, narrow way, typically having walls either side, that allows access between buildings or to different rooms within a building. <i>Her hotel was at the end of a narrow passageway off the main street.</i>
path	An established line of travel or access. <i>The path continues alongside the river for half a mile.</i>
<u>porch</u>	A covered shelter projecting in front of the entrance of a building. <i>Daniel and Lydia sat out on the porch for many hours.</i>

residence

The official house or establishment of an important person (as a sovereign or president).

*The palace was designated the official **residence** of the head of state.*

roof

Provide a building with a roof cover a building with a roof.

*The **roof** of the cave fell in.*

skyway

A raised motorway.

***Skyways** from 18 000 to 40 000 feet resemble a highway system.*

street

The streets of a city viewed as a depressed environment in which there is poverty and crime and prostitution and dereliction.

*She tried to keep her children off the **street**.*

theater

A building where theatrical performances or motion-picture shows can be presented.

*He served in the Vietnam **theater** for three years.*

walkway

A path set aside for walking.
