Associations of "Alarmed" (30 Words)

afraid	Filled with regret or concern; used often to soften an unpleasant statement. <i>Afraid to ask questions.</i>
aghast	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation. <i>She winced aghast at his cruelty.</i>
anxious	Causing or fraught with or showing anxiety. <i>Cast anxious glances behind her.</i>
apprehensive	In fear or dread of possible evil or harm. <i>He felt apprehensive about going home.</i>
caitiff	Despicably mean and cowardly. <i>A caitiff knight.</i>
confused	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>The flood of questions left her bewildered and confused.</i>
coward	English dramatist and actor and composer noted for his witty and sophisticated comedies (1899-1973). <i>They had run away the cowards.</i>
cowardice	The trait of lacking courage. <i>My cowardice got the better of me and I crept out of the room.</i>
cowardly	(of an action) carried out against a person who is unable to retaliate. <i>A cowardly attack on a helpless victim.</i>
craven	A cowardly person. <i>A craven abdication of his moral duty.</i>
dismayed	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
fainthearted	Lacking conviction or boldness or courage.
fear	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>The love and fear of God.</i>

fearful	Experiencing or showing fear. <i>Fearful slum conditions.</i>
fearfulness	The trait of being afraid.
<u>formidable</u>	Inspiring fear. <i>Had a formidable array of compositions to his credit.</i>
fright	Frighten. <i>I jumped up in fright.</i>
frightened	Made afraid. <i>I m not frightened of him.</i>
<u>frightening</u>	The act of inspiring with fear. <i>A frightening experience.</i>
horrified	Filled with horror; extremely shocked. <i>The horrified spectators.</i>
<u>insecurity</u>	Uncertainty or anxiety about oneself; lack of confidence. <i>The insecurity of wireless networks.</i>
scared	Made afraid. <i>We re both scared of spiders.</i>
<u>shocked</u>	Struck with fear, dread, or consternation.
<u>skittish</u>	(of an animal, especially a horse) nervous or excitable; easily scared. <i>My skittish and immature mother.</i>
<u>terrified</u>	Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation. <i>The terrified horse bolted.</i>
<u>terrifying</u>	Causing extreme terror. <i>A terrifying wail.</i>
timorous	Timid by nature or revealing timidity. <i>In a timorous tone.</i>
<u>uneasy</u>	Socially uncomfortable; unsure and constrained in manner. <i>An uneasy coalition government.</i>
worried	Mentally upset over possible misfortune or danger etc. <i>A worried frown.</i>
<u>worry</u>	(of a dog) chase and attack (livestock, especially sheep). <i>His worry over the prospect of being fired.</i>
