| alchemy | A seemingly magical process of transformation, creation, or combination. <i>Occult sciences such as alchemy and astrology.</i> |
| ambidextrous | Equally skillful with each hand. <i>Few of us are naturally ambidextrous.</i> |
| change | Change clothes put on different clothes. <i>She changed in Chicago on her way to the East coast.</i> |
| charlatan | A flamboyant deceiver; one who attracts customers with tricks or jokes. <i>A self confessed con artist and charlatan.</i> |
| compound | Composed of more than one partcompound flower heads. <i>A compound of hydrogen and oxygen.</i> |
| detector | Rectifier that extracts modulation from a radio carrier wave. <i>Methane detectors.</i> |
| eclectic | Someone who selects according to the eclectic method. <i>Her musical tastes are eclectic.</i> |
| entrance | Something that provides access (to get in or get out). <i>About fifty people attempted to gain entrance.</i> |
| fascinate | To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>I ve always been fascinated by computers.</i> |
| hypnotic | A drug that induces sleep. <i>Read the bedtime story in a hypnotic voice.</i> |
| liar | A person who has lied or who lies repeatedly. <i>Shelley wasn t a good liar.</i> |
| liquefy | Make (a solid substance) liquid, as by heating. <i>The minimum pressure required to liquefy a gas.</i> |
| magic | Move change or create by or as if by magic. <i>Confidence is the magic ingredient needed to spark recovery.</i> |

| <u>magician</u> | One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>He was the magician of the fan belt.</i> |
| medical | Relating to medicine as distinguished from surgery, psychiatry, etc. <i>A medical centre.</i> |
| <u>metal</u> | Cover with metal. <i>A metallic compound.</i> |
| metallurgy | The branch of science and technology concerned with the properties of metals and their production and purification. <i>The constituents of bronze can be scientifically analysed to gain information on ancient metallurgy.</i> |
| metamorphose | (of an insect or amphibian) undergo metamorphosis, especially into the adult form. <i>The salesman metamorphosed into an ugly beetle.</i> |
| <u>mold</u> | Sculpture produced by molding. <i>The dress molds her beautiful figure.</i> |
| necromancy | The belief in magical spells that harness occult forces or evil spirits to produce unnatural effects in the world. <i>Alchemy necromancy and other magic practices.</i> |
| <u>occult</u> | Cause an eclipse of (a celestial body) by intervention. <i>An occult ceremony.</i> |
| pharmacist | A person who is professionally qualified to prepare and dispense medicinal drugs. |
| reshape | Shape anew or differently. <i>The new foreign minister reshaped the foreign policy of his country.</i> |
| <u>ritual</u> | Of or relating to or employed in social rites or rituals Nadine Gordimer. <i>Ancient fertility rituals.</i> |
| ruffle | Pleat or gather into a ruffle. <i>Ruffle somebody's composure.</i> |
| sedative | Tending to soothe or tranquilize. <i>The seeds have a sedative effect.</i> |
| sleight | Adroitness in using the hands. <i>Except by sleight of logic the two positions cannot be harmonized.</i> |
| synthesize | Combine so as to form a more complex, product. <i>Vitamin D only synthesizes when sunlight is available.</i> |
| <u>transform</u> | Subject to a mathematical transformation. <i>This experience transformed her completely.</i> |
