## Associations of "Alchemist" (30 Words)

<a href="#">alchemy</a>	A seemingly magical process of transformation, creation, or combination. <i>Occult sciences such as <b>alchemy</b> and astrology.</i>
<b>ambidextrous</b>	Equally skillful with each hand. <i>Few of us are naturally <b>ambidextrous</b>.</i>
<b>change</b>	Change clothes put on different clothes. <i>She <b>changed</b> in Chicago on her way to the East coast.</i>
<b>charlatan</b>	A flamboyant deceiver; one who attracts customers with tricks or jokes. <i>A self confessed con artist and <b>charlatan</b>.</i>
<a href="#">compound</a>	Composed of more than one partcompound flower heads. <i>A <b>compound</b> of hydrogen and oxygen.</i>
<b>detector</b>	Rectifier that extracts modulation from a radio carrier wave. <i>Methane <b>detectors</b>.</i>
<b>eclectic</b>	Someone who selects according to the eclectic method. <i>Her musical tastes are <b>eclectic</b>.</i>
<a href="#">entrance</a>	Something that provides access (to get in or get out). <i>About fifty people attempted to gain <b>entrance</b>.</i>
<a href="#">fascinate</a>	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>I ve always been <b>fascinated</b> by computers.</i>
<b>hypnotic</b>	A drug that induces sleep. <i>Read the bedtime story in a <b>hypnotic</b> voice.</i>
<b>liar</b>	A person who has lied or who lies repeatedly. <i>Shelley wasn t a good <b>liar</b>.</i>
<b>liquefy</b>	Make (a solid substance) liquid, as by heating. <i>The minimum pressure required to <b>liquefy</b> a gas.</i>
<b>magic</b>	Move change or create by or as if by magic. <i>Confidence is the <b>magic</b> ingredient needed to spark recovery.</i>

<b><u>magician</u></b>	One who practices magic or sorcery. <i>He was the <b>magician</b> of the fan belt.</i>
<b>medical</b>	Relating to medicine as distinguished from surgery, psychiatry, etc. <i>A <b>medical</b> centre.</i>
<b><u>metal</u></b>	Cover with metal. <i>A <b>metallic</b> compound.</i>
<b>metallurgy</b>	The branch of science and technology concerned with the properties of metals and their production and purification. <i>The constituents of bronze can be scientifically analysed to gain information on ancient <b>metallurgy</b>.</i>
<b>metamorphose</b>	(of an insect or amphibian) undergo metamorphosis, especially into the adult form. <i>The salesman <b>metamorphosed</b> into an ugly beetle.</i>
<b><u>mold</u></b>	Sculpture produced by molding. <i>The dress <b>molds</b> her beautiful figure.</i>
<b>necromancy</b>	The belief in magical spells that harness occult forces or evil spirits to produce unnatural effects in the world. <i>Alchemy <b>necromancy</b> and other magic practices.</i>
<b><u>occult</u></b>	Cause an eclipse of (a celestial body) by intervention. <i>An <b>occult</b> ceremony.</i>
<b>pharmacist</b>	A person who is professionally qualified to prepare and dispense medicinal drugs.
<b>reshape</b>	Shape anew or differently. <i>The new foreign minister <b>reshaped</b> the foreign policy of his country.</i>
<b><u>ritual</u></b>	Of or relating to or employed in social rites or rituals Nadine Gordimer. <i>Ancient fertility <b>rituals</b>.</i>
<b>ruffle</b>	Pleat or gather into a ruffle. <i><b>Ruffle</b> somebody's composure.</i>
<b>sedative</b>	Tending to soothe or tranquilize. <i>The seeds have a <b>sedative</b> effect.</i>
<b>sleight</b>	Adroitness in using the hands. <i>Except by <b>sleight</b> of logic the two positions cannot be harmonized.</i>
<b>synthesize</b>	Combine so as to form a more complex, product. <i>Vitamin D only <b>synthesizes</b> when sunlight is available.</i>
<b><u>transform</u></b>	Subject to a mathematical transformation. <i>This experience <b>transformed</b> her completely.</i>
